WAC 296-14-6200 What is a residence modification? A residence modification is a permanent change to an existing residence or a repair of a modification previously approved and paid for by the department or self-insured employer, or a modification made when constructing a new residence.

Household appliances such as refrigerators, washers, and dryers, are generally not residence modifications and the department or selfinsured employer will approve them only under unique circumstances as approved by the supervisor.

Example: As part of an approved residence modification, the kitchen counters are lowered. To meet the needs of the worker, the department or self-insured employer may approve the purchase of a dropin range or cooktop.
