WAC 388-829A-030 What type of training and support may the alternative living service provider offer? The alternative living service provider may provide training, assistance, and/or support in the following areas, as identified in the client's individual support plan (ISP):

- (1) Establishing a residence.
- (2) Home living including:
- (a) Personal hygiene;
- (b) Food and nutrition; and
- (c) Home management.
- (3) Community living including:
- (a) Accessing public and private community services;
- (b) Essential shopping; and
- (c) Transportation.
- (4) Health and safety including:
- (a) Understanding personal safety and emergency procedures;
- (b) Physical, mental and dental health; and
- (c) Developing and practicing an emergency response plan to address natural and other disasters.
  - (5) Social activities including:
  - (a) Community integration; and
  - (b) Building relationships.
  - (6) Protection and advocacy including:
  - (a) Money management and budgeting;
  - (b) Protecting self from exploitation;
  - (c) Making choices and decisions; and
  - (d) Asserting rights and finding advocacy.
- (7) Other training and support to assist a client to live independently.
