EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 991
(Amending Order No. 893)

EFFECTIVE AUGUST 24, 1965

WASHINGTON STANDARDS FOR APPLES

(Effective for all Apples marketed within the State)

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.17 RCW, after due notice and public hearings held at Yakima, Wenatchee and Okanogan on July 14, 15 and 16, 1965, respectively (Pursuant to RCW 34.04), do hereby establish the following Amendment to the Washington Standards for Apples.


The adoption of this Emergency Order establishing an Amendment to the Washington Standards for Apples is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare. It is necessary that this Order become effective immediately in order that the 1965 crop of apples may be packed according to this Amendment.

AMENDMENT

Regulation 6, Section 2, paragraph 4, shall be amended to read as follows:

"To be fairly well filled a container must have not less than forty (40) pounds net of apples, EXCEPT, containers of Golden Delicious, Jonathan, McIntosh and Rome Beauty varieties only, shall be considered fairly well filled when they contain not less than thirty-eight (38) pounds net of apples".
