REGULATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION OF PROPRIETARY VARIETIES

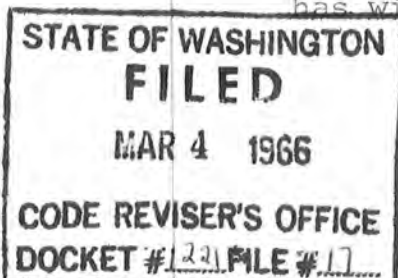
I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.48 RCW, Laws of 1961, after due notice as provided under Chapters 42.32 and 34.04 RCW, and a public hearing held in Yakima, Washington, on February 25, 1966, do hereby promulgate the following regulations relating to the certification of proprietary varieties.


Regulation 1. Definition

Proprietary Variety: Crop variety which a person or company, hereafter referred to as owner, has exclusive production and/or marketing rights.

Regulation 2. Certification procedure.

- a. Owner must submit a written request to the certifying agency for variety certification prior to submitting an application for certification.
- b. Owner of the variety shall co-sign or approve each application submitted for certification by another party.
- c. Either the owner or grower may withdraw the application for certification at any time prior to tagging.
- d. Owner shall specify the processing plant where the proprietary variety shall be handled, and the certifying agency shall refuse certification if and when seed appears in another processing plant.
- e. Upon receipt of the certification application form, the certifying agency shall advise the grower that he is growing a proprietary variety and that the owner has the privilege of canceling certification at any time.
- f. The owner or his local agent or representative shall be responsible for fees accrued on that seed on which he has withdrawn the application for certification.
