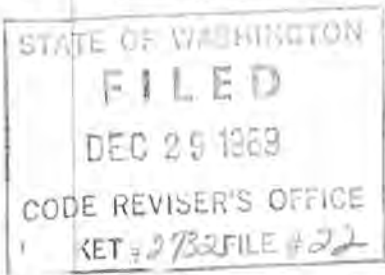

Horticultural Inspection Fees

WAC 16-400-004 PROMULGATION. (This promulgation relates only to WAC 16-400-040 and WAC 16-400-050 only of Order No. 1121.)

I, Donald W. Moos, director of agriculture of the state of Washington by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.17 RCW and after due notice as provided under Chapters 34.04 and 42.32 RCW and a public hearing held in Spokane, Washington on December 17, 1969, do hereby promulgate the following regulations relating to horticulture inspection fees; and amending WAC 16-400-040 and WAC 16-400-050.

AMD

WAC 16-400-040 VEGETABLES.

Asparagus in 12 lb containers	1-1/2¢ each
Asparagus in 26 - 35 lb containers	2-3/4¢ each
Corn - crates	3¢ each
Cantaloupe (60 lb container unit)	4¢ each
Tomatoes - L.A. Lugs or loose in containers	2-1/2¢ each
Tomatoes - In flats	1-7/8¢ each
Onions	4¢ cwt.
Potatoes and seed potatoes	3-1/2¢ cwt.
Potatoes where percentage grade needed or major fraction thereof (diversion program or similar program)	30¢ per ton
Processing potatoes	2-3/4¢ cwt. Complete inspection (Rate reduced for service required)

Inspection fees for cabbage, celery, lettuce, cauliflower, grapes, rhubarb, rutabagas, watermelons, squash, carrots, etc., shall be at the regular hourly rate of \$7.25 per hour, or \$14.00 for a carload, with a maximum of 2 hours time, for domestic use only.

WAC 16-400-050 DEFENSE SUBSISTENCE SUPPLY CENTER OR OTHER FEDERAL AGENCIES. Fees as established by USDA.


- (1) For Canadian export inspections only where specific charges are not established by this regulation by Order No. 1121.

1 - 25 packages	\$5.25
26 - 50 packages	7.00
51 - 150 packages	10.00
151 - 400 packages	14.75
401 - customary car lot	23.00 except where specific commodity charges are established.
- (2) Terminal wholesale market inspections (Domestic) in Tacoma, Seattle and Spokane. Minimum chg. 1 hour @ \$7.25 hour.
- (3) State institution inspections \$7.25 hour. Minimum fee shall be \$4.00.
