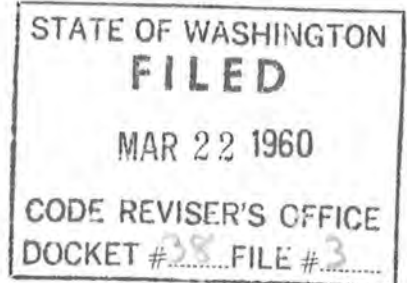

ORDER NO. 563

(Superseding Order No. 502)

Effective March 29, 1950



FOR THE REGULATION OF THE USE OF BUTTER SUBSTITUTES
IN EATING ESTABLISHMENTS

I, Sverre N. Omdahl, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of authority vested in me under Section 3, Chapter 13, Session Laws of 1949, do make and promulgate the following rules and regulations governing the sale, use or serving of oleomargarine and butter substitutes in eating establishments:

On and after March 29, 1950, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation who operate any hotel, eating house, cafe, restaurant, boarding house or public conveyance to serve or use oleomargarine or butter substitutes unless they shall have in such hotel, eating house, cafe, restaurant, boarding house or public conveyance a conspicuous, durable sign in block, capital letters of not less than two inches in height and one-half inch in width, in ink the words reading, "BUTTER SUBSTITUTES SERVED AND USED HERE"; and if menus are used, the words reading, "Butter substitutes served and used here" shall be made a conspicuous part of each menu.

Any person violating this regulation shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor.
