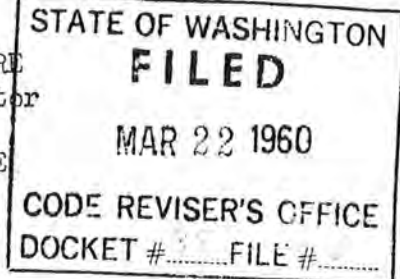

Amendment to Pea Moth Quarantine Order No. 23

It has been determined by the Director of Agriculture that it is advisable to amend Sections 3 and 5 of Quarantine Order No. 23 (Order No. 375), to read as follows:

Section 3. Definitions

Pest: Pea Moth (Laspeyresia nigricana, Steph.), a pest of peas and vetch.

Infested Area: All Counties lying west of the Cascade Mountains.

Control Area: All of Snohomish County and that part of Skagit County lying West of Range 5 East, and East of Swinomish Slough, except the North half of Section 36, and all of Sections 25, 26, 27, 28, and 35, all in T. 36 N. R. 2 E. of the W.M., being particularly bounded and described as follows:
Beginning at the Northeast Corner of Section 1, T. 36 N. R. 4 E. of the W.M., and running thence, South on the Range line to the Southeast Corner of Section 36, T. 33 N. R. 4 E. of W.M., thence, West on the Township line to salt water shore; thence, Northwesterly along the Shore line to the South end of Swinomish Slough, in the center of Section 1, T. 33 N. R. 2 E.; thence along the center line of said Swinomish Slough to intersect the North line of Section 11, T. 34 N. R. 2 E.; thence, Easterly and Northerly along the shores of Padilla Bay, to intersect the east-west center line of Section 36, T. 36 N. R. 2 E. W.M.; thence, East on the center line of said Section 36 to the shore of Bellingham Bay; thence, easterly, northerly, and northwesterly, along the shoreline of said Bellingham Bay to the North line of Skagit County; thence, East on said North County line to the point of beginning.

Non-Infested Area: All Counties lying east of the Cascade Mountains.

Regulated Products: All peas and vetch, and parts thereof.

Section 5. Regulations for Control Area

Regulation 1. Regulating the growing, harvesting, distribution and inspection within the boundaries of Snohomish County.

- (a) The growing of peas and vetch, and parts thereof, for seed or feed purposes in Snohomish County is prohibited, except that peas and vetch may be grown if harvested, ensilaged or destroyed prior to the time the pea moth larvae begin to emerge from the host pods.

Regulation 2. Regulating the growing, harvesting, distribution, and inspection in that part of Skagit County lying West of Range 5, East, and East of Swinomish Slough, except the North half of Section 36, and all of Sections 25, 26, 27, 28 and 35, all in T. 36 N. R. 2 E. of the W.M., being particularly bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast Corner of Section 1, T. 36 N. R. 4 E. of the W.M., and running thence, South on the Range line to the Southeast Corner of Section 36, T. 33 N. R. 4 E. of W.M., thence, West on the Township line to salt water shore; thence, Northwesterly along the Shore Line to the South end of Swinomish Slough, in the center of Section 1, T. 33 N. R. 2 E.; thence, along the center line of said Swinomish Slough to intersect the North line of Section 11, T. 34 N. R. 2 E.; thence, Easterly and Northerly along the shores of Padilla Bay, to intersect the east-west center line of Section 36, T. 36 N. R. 2 E. W.M.; thence, East on the Center Line of said Section 36 to the shore of Bellingham Bay; thence, easterly, northerly and northwesterly, along the shore line of said Bellingham Bay to the North line of Skagit County; thence, East on said North County line to the point of beginning.

- (a) Any person growing peas or vetch for seed or feed purposes shall register his intention with the Department of Agriculture within 30 days after planting.
- (b) Peas and vetch grown for seed or feed purposes shall be sprayed or dusted with a formula approved by the Washington State Department of Agriculture after consultation with the State College of Washington and the United States Department of Agriculture. Approved formula or formulas for spraying shall be available at the County Horticultural Office at the time fields are registered.
- (c) Peas and vetch, or parts thereof, grown for seed or feed purposes in this area must be free from the pea moth larvae at all times during the growing season.
- (d) If fields of peas or vetch registered for growing for seed or feed purposes, upon inspection by the Department of Agriculture, are found to be infested with the larvae of the pea moth, or show feeding damage caused by the pea moth larvae, regardless of whether or not they were dusted or sprayed according to the recommendations, they shall be destroyed in accordance with instructions of the Department of Agriculture, except that peas may be vined for processing purposes if done before the pea moth larvae begin to leave the pods.
- (e) All peas and vetch, or parts thereof, grown for other than seed or feed purposes within the control area shall be harvested, ensilaged, or destroyed prior to the time the pea moth larvae begin to emerge from the host pods.

This amendment will be effective on and after February 17, 1955.
