PERTAINING TO THE CLUB ROOT DISEASE OF CRUCIFERS

WHEREAS, It has been determined that a dangerous disease, commonly known as Club Root (Plasmodiophora brassicae Wor.), injurious to certain crucifers, is known to exist generally throughout the United States and in certain areas within the state of Washington, and

WHEREAS, It has been further determined that this disease threatens the continuing existence of the state's crucifer industry, particularly through the probable further distribution resulting in a serious menace to all non-infested areas,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Sverre N. Omdahl, Director of the Department of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Chapter 292 of the Session Laws of 1927, do hereby proclaim and establish a quarantine and do hereby order that no shipments of plants with roots of cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts shall be made into or within the State of Washington except in conformity with conditions and regulations hereinafter set forth.

PEST: Club Root Disease (Plasmodiophora brassicae Wor.).

AREA UNDER QUARANTINE: All states and districts within the United States, including the state of Washington.

REGULATED PRODUCTS: All plants with roots of cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING SHIPMENTS:

1. Plant Bed Inspection

All cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts plant beds within the state of Washington must be inspected prior to lifting the plants for distribution.

2. Movement of Plants

The movement of all planting stock of cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts is prohibited unless a certificate has been issued by an authorized inspector of the Department of Agriculture stating that the plants are free from Club Root disease.

3. Disposition of non-certificated plants


Any plants moving into or within the State of Washington without a certificate of inspection stating that the plants are free from Club Root disease shall be destroyed or returned to the shipper at his or their expense.

VIOLATIONS AND PENALTY


All violations of this order shall be dealt with according to the provisions of Section 7, Chapter 292, Laws of 1927.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This order shall take effect on and after May 11, 1955.
