A PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, it has been determined that a dangerous plant pest of grasses and other crops known as European Crane Fly (Tipula paludosa) is present in the State of Washington.

WHEREAS, the movement of soil, plants with roots, grass sod, or soil moving equipment will or may spread this pest.

WHEREAS, the spread will cause severe economic and ecological losses to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Daniel J. Evans, Governor of the State of Washington hereby proclaim that effective January 3, 1972, the quarantine shall be amended to include all of Whatcom County west of Silver Lake Road and Mount Baker Highway due to the fact that infestations have been found close to the city of Bellingham and can be expected to spread further south in the near future.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the State of Washington to be affixed at Olympia, this third day of December, A.D., nineteen hundred and seventy-one.

WAC 16-485-002 PROMULGATION. (1) Whereas, it has been determined that a dangerous plant pest of grasses and other crops known as European Crane Fly (Tipula paludosa) is present in the state of Washington.

(2) Whereas, the movement of soil, plants with roots, grass sod, or soil moving equipment will or may spread this pest.

(3) Whereas, the spread will cause severe economic and ecological losses to the public.

(4) Now therefore, I, Donald W. Moos, director of the department of agriculture of the state of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me by chapter 17.24 RCW relating to insect pests and plant diseases, after public hearing held in Mount Vernon, Washington, on December 1, 1971, pursuant to chapters 34.04 and 42.30 RCW, amend rules to include all of Whatcom county west of Silver Lake road and Mount Baker highway due to the fact that infestations have been found close to the city of Bellingham and can be expected to spread further south in the near future.



WAC 16-485-015 QUARANTINE AREA. The portion of Whatcom county, Washington, bounded by a line beginning at a point where the northwest corner of the city of Blaine junctions with the Whatcom county-Canadian international boundary line; thence proceeding east along said boundary line to its junction with Silver Lake road; thence south along said road to its intersection with Mount Baker highway; thence southerly along said highway to its junction with the Whatcom-Skagit county line; thence westerly to Bellingham Bay; thence northerly along said bay to Hale Passage; thence westerly along said passage to Georgia Strait; thence northerly along said strait to the point of beginning.
