
I, Stewart Bledsoe, director of agriculture of the state of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under chapters 15.58 and 17.21 RCW, and 34.04 RCW, do hereby promulgate the following emergency regulation relating to the use of high volatile ester formulations of 2,4-D in 15 counties in eastern Washington.

The adoption of this emergency order allowing the use of butyl ester formulations of 2,4-D in parts of 15 counties of eastern Washington is necessary due to inclement weather conditions and critical shortages of all 2,4-D products, especially low volatile and amine 2,4-D formulations. It is necessary that this order become effective immediately in order that available high volatile formulations be applied during a time relatively safe to susceptible crops.

Regulation 1. Restrictions. The current eastern Washington 2,4-D orders shall be amended to allow the use and application of butyl ester formulations up to May 1 in the following counties or county areas during allowable times whenever the temperature is less than 70° and only when the wind is blowing from the west, southwest, or south: Asotin; Area 3 Walla Walla; Areas 3 and 4 Franklin; Kittitas; Areas 3 and 4 Grant; Area 3 Adams; Area 4 Whitman; Area 3 Spokane; Areas 3 and 4 Lincoln; Area 4 Douglas; Area 4 Okanogan; Ferry; Stevens; and Pend Oreille counties. Application of butyl ester formulations in Klickitat County may be made up to May 1 and applications shall be made in accordance with Order No. 1347, Regulation 3.

All other restrictions concerning the sale, use, and application of all other formulations of phenoxy hormone type herbicides in eastern Washington shall remain in effect.
