Order No. 917

Amending Orders No. 884 and 848

Effective May 25, 1963

I, Joe Dwyer, Director of Agriculture, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.48, RCW after due notice as provided under Chapter 34.04 and 42.32, RCW and a public hearing held in Yakima on April 4, 1963, do promulgate the following regulation amending Orders No. 884 relating to rules for seed certification and No. 848, Regulations under the Washington State Seed Law.

Regulation 1. Order No. 884, Regulation 3, Section 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The varieties eligible and the certification scheme for each are as follows:

Ranger, Rambler, Talent
and Williamsburg

Foundation seed is eligible to produce Registered seed.
Registered seed is eligible to produce Certified seed.
Certified seed is for forage production only.

Buffalo, Cody, Vernal,
Alfa, Lahanton, Culver,
and WL-202

Foundation seed is eligible to produce Certified seed only.
Certified seed is for forage production only.

Grimm and Ladak

Certified seed is eligible to produce Certified seed.

DuPuits, Flamande,
and Cardinal

Certified production only from approved imported seed stocks.

Regulation 2. Order No. 884, Regulation 4, Section 6 is hereby amended to read as follows:

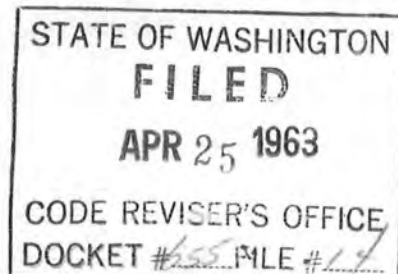
Section 6. Inspection requirements shall be as follows:

1. At least two field inspections will be made--one when the plants are at the third-leaf stage, and one when plants are fully grown and the first Beans maturing.
2. A greenhouse test for mosaic may be required if the certifying agency deems it necessary.
3. The combined results of field inspection, laboratory test, and greenhouse test, when necessary, will determine final certification.

Regulation 3. Order No. 884, Regulation 5, Section 2 is hereby amended by adding the following:

Bromegrass: Sac Smooth Bromegrass**
Orchardgrass: Chinook** and Tammisto**
Ryegrass: Norlea Perennial**

**These varieties are to be certified on a limited generation basis in which Foundation seed is eligible to produce Certified seed only.



Effective with the 1963 crop, Delta Kentucky Bluegrass, Climax and Drummond Timothy will be certified on Foundation to Certified basis, deleting the Registered class as requested by the Canadian originators of these varieties.

Regulation 4. Order No. 884, Regulation 5, Section 6 is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:

- 3. Isolation for the Certified class of cross pollinated species identified as "C" in paragraph 1, and certified on limited certification scheme shall be 10 rods.

Regulation 5. Order No. 884, Regulation 5, Section 10 is hereby amended by changing the germination standards as follows:

Orchardgrass: The minimum percent germination for certified classes of Latar, Pennlate and Masshardy shall be reduced from 85 to 80, all other varieties of Orchardgrass shall remain at 85%.

Regulation 6. Order No. 884, Regulation 8, Section 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The varieties eligible and the certification scheme for each are as follows:

Dollard, Kenland, Pennscott, Lakeland, Chesapeake, & Ulva:	Foundation seed is eligible to produce Certified seed. Certified seed is for forage production only.

Regulation 7. Order No. 884, Regulation 11, Section 2 is hereby amended by adding the following small grain varieties to the list of those eligible for certification:

Barley: Traill and Unitan
Wheat: Idaed 59 and Sentry

Regulation 8. Order No. 848, Regulation 4, Section 3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Miscellaneous testing fees shall be as follows:

- 1. Examination of samples for Noxious Weeds or other factors will be charged at a minimum fee of \$3.00 or at the rate of \$5.00 per hour.
- 2. Rush samples for purity.....\$1.00
- 3. Tetrazolium tests -
 - Cereals and Legumes.....\$3.00
 - All other seeds.....\$6.00
- 4. Bean test plot examination for mosaic.....\$5.00
