EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 2, 1976

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE  
IMPORTATION OF ANIMALS INTO  
THE STATE OF WASHINGTON

NEW WAC 16-54-004 PROMULGATION. I, Stewart Bledsoe, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 16.36 RCW and 16.44 RCW, after due notice as provided under Chapter 34.04 RCW and a public hearing held in Ellensburg on October 29, 1976, do promulgate the following regulations:

AMD WAC 16-54-081 DOMESTIC BOVINE ANIMALS. All domestic bovine animals, (including bison) except those for immediate slaughter, shall be accompanied by a health certificate (WAC 16-54-030 this Order) and shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Tuberculosis.

(a) All beef and dairy cattle must originate from herds not under quarantine in a not less than modified accredited area.

(2) Brucellosis.

(a) All beef and dairy breeding cattle entering the State shall have been brucellosis tested negative within thirty (30) days of entry. Beef and dairy cattle originating from a modified certified area will be quarantined upon arrival and retested 30-60 days after arrival at owner's expense.

Provided that cattle in certain instances will be exempt from the foregoing provisions as follows:

(i) Cattle from certified brucellosis free herds are exempt from test requirements.

(ii) Beef and dairy breeding animals, certified by the State of Idaho as originating from herds under MCI and/or BRT surveillance and said herds are known not to be brucellosis infected, north of the Salmon River in Idaho.

(iii) Beef and dairy cattle certified by the State of Oregon as originating from herds under MCI and/or BRT surveillance and said herds are known not to be brucellosis infected north of Highway 20 and west of Highway 97 in Oregon.

(iv) Calves under six (6) months of age, steers and spayed heifers, officially vaccinated dairy cattle under twenty (20) months and officially vaccinated beef cattle under twenty-four (24) months from herds or area not under quarantine are exempt from test requirements.

(v) Immediate slaughter cattle in accordance with USDA CFR Title 9 requirements consigned directly to a federally inspected slaughtering establishment.

(b) Cattle from exempt areas shall not be commingled with any other cattle, except cattle specifically exempted under the provisions of this WAC Chapter 16-54, while being transported from such exempt area into the State of Washington. If cattle from exempt area are commingled with cattle subject to tests, as herein provided for, while being transported to the State of Washington, then all such cattle shall become subject to the testing requirements provided for herein.

(c) Feeder cattle shall be accompanied by an official health certificate. Brucellosis test requirements will apply to all eligible cattle consigned to a feed lot; provided that such brucellosis test requirements shall not apply to female cattle consigned to a registered quarantined feed lot or a certified quarantined feed lot.

(i) Feeder cattle entering a registered quarantined feed lot will be accompanied with a health certificate indicating the name, location and official registration number (F brand) of the registered quarantined feed lot. The cattle will be branded with the (F brand) assigned to that registered quarantined feed lot as they enter and may be released for slaughter only.

(ii) Cattle entering a certified quarantined feed lot will be accompanied with a health certificate indicating the name, location and official registration number of the certified quarantined feed lot, such number to be assigned to certified quarantined feed lots by the Department of Agriculture.

(d) All feed lot operators will maintain adequate records to identify animal to herd of origin should a MCI positive animal be disclosed from said feed lot.

(e) Animals will not be allowed to leave a certified quarantined feed lot for other than slaughter purposes except under the following exceptions:

(i) Calves under thirty (30) days of age may leave a certified quarantined feed lot without testing.

(ii) Female animals over thirty (30) days of age, maintained in a certified quarantined feed lot may leave that lot for other than slaughter purposes subject to the following procedure:

(iii) They shall be individually identified by an official identification tag.


(iv) A brucellosis test shall be conducted by an accredited veterinarian retained by the management of the certified quarantined feed lot and the test shall result in a negative finding.

(v) Animals so tested shall be isolated and kept separate and apart from other animals and retested negative to brucellosis thirty (30) to sixty (60) days after the original test.

(vi) Female animals passing the above qualifications and made eligible for release from the certified quarantined feed lot will be branded "91W" on the right shoulder by a veterinarian assigned to the Animal Health Division of the Department of Agriculture before being moved from the premises at which last tested.

REP WAC 16-54-003 is hereby repealed.
