
ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2030

1 AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition and fee waivers,
2 reduced fees, and residency exemptions; amending RCW 28B.15.535 and
3 28B.15.558; adding new sections to chapter 28B.15 RCW; and creating a
4 new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** Each state university, regional
7 university, state college, and the community college system shall
8 include a special report on tuition and fee waivers, reduced fee
9 programs, and residency exemptions in its biennial budget request. The
10 report shall include specific data requested by, and in a format
11 designed by, the office of financial management in consultation with
12 the higher education coordinating board. These special reports shall
13 be aggregated and included in the governor's biennial budget document
14 as part of an overview of higher education.

1 education enrolled in said institutions' courses on a space available
2 basis pursuant to the following conditions:

3 (a) Employees shall register for and be enrolled in courses on a
4 space available basis, and no new course sections shall be created as
5 a direct result of such registration;

6 (b) Enrollment information on employees registered on a space
7 available basis shall be maintained separately from other enrollment
8 information and shall not be included in official enrollment reports,
9 nor shall persons enrolled pursuant to the provisions of this section
10 be considered in any enrollment statistics which would affect budgetary
11 determinations;

12 (c) Employees registering on a space available basis shall be
13 charged a registration fee (~~((of not less than five dollars))~~) that will
14 fully cover institutional costs of administering each employee's
15 enrollment.

16 (2) The governing boards of the respective colleges and
17 universities may waive tuition and services and activities fees for
18 full-time intercollegiate center for nursing education, cooperative
19 extension service, and agricultural research employees of Washington
20 State University for such employees stationed off the Pullman, Whitman
21 county campus: PROVIDED, That such waiver complies with the conditions
22 spelled out in subsection (1)(a), (b), and (c) above.

23 (3) The boards of regents of the state universities, the boards of
24 trustees of the regional universities and The Evergreen State College,
25 and the state board for community college education with respect to
26 community colleges, shall adopt guidelines for the implementation of
27 employee waivers granted pursuant to this section.

28 **Sec. 5.** RCW 28B.15.558 and 1990 c 88 s 1 are each amended to read
29 as follows:

1 (1) The governing boards of state institutions of higher education
2 as defined in RCW 28B.10.016 may waive the tuition and services and
3 activities fees for state employees as defined under subsection (2) of
4 this section pursuant to the following conditions:

5 (a) Such state employees shall register for and be enrolled in
6 courses on a space available basis and no new course sections shall be
7 created as a result of the registration;

8 (b) Enrollment information on state employees registered pursuant
9 to this section shall be maintained separately from other enrollment
10 information and shall not be included in official enrollment reports,
11 nor shall such state employees be considered in any enrollment
12 statistics which would affect budgetary determinations; and

13 (c) State employees registering on a space available basis shall be
14 charged a registration fee (~~(of not less than five dollars)~~) that will
15 fully cover institutional costs of administering each state employee's
16 enrollment.

17 (2) For the purposes of this section, "state employees" means
18 permanent full-time employees in classified service under chapters
19 28B.16 and 41.06 RCW.

20 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** For any space available waiver program
21 that directs an institution to charge an administrative fee of not less
22 than five dollars, each institution of higher education granting a
23 waiver under the program shall charge an administrative fee that will
24 fully cover the institution's cost of administering a participating
25 student's enrollment. The administrative fee shall be the same for all
26 space available waivers granted by the institution, and shall be
27 charged to all students receiving a space available waiver by the
28 institution.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act are
2 each added to chapter 28B.15 RCW.
