1            AN ACT Relating to teacher preparation programs; adding a new  
2 section to chapter 28B.10 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 28A.305  
3 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.**            The legislature finds that the demands  
6 on teachers in the K-12 schools are evolving as society changes.  
7 Factors such as the increase in the number of single-parent households,  
8 drug and alcohol abuse, high dropout rates, and increasing rates of  
9 crime, among other things, are changing the nature of the teaching  
10 enterprise. The legislature also finds that college and university  
11 faculty engaged in training prospective teachers need to have first-  
12 hand experience of the nature of this changing enterprise. The  
13 legislature finds that a recently certified teacher in the K-12 system  
14 is required to engage in continuing education in order to stay current  
15 in his or her field. The legislature intends to require higher

1 education faculty whose primary responsibility is teaching prospective  
2 teachers to engage in a form of public service and continuing education  
3 by teaching in the public schools.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) Each teacher preparation program subject to RCW 28A.305.130(1)  
7 shall annually develop and implement a plan to increase the level of  
8 collaboration and interaction between the program's faculty and K-12  
9 schools in the state. The plan shall require, to the maximum extent  
10 feasible, that each member of the faculty annually provide instruction  
11 in K-12 classrooms.

12 (2) The governing board of each state university, regional  
13 university, and state college shall adopt salary policies that ensure  
14 that faculty members fulfilling the responsibilities described in this  
15 section are appropriately rewarded for their public service and  
16 participation in continuing education.

17 (3) Teacher preparation programs of each state university, regional  
18 university, and state college shall be subject to the approval of the  
19 state board of education as required under RCW 28A.305.130 and section  
20 3 of this act.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.305  
22 RCW to read as follows:

23 In addition to other approval requirements for teacher preparation  
24 programs under RCW 28A.305.130(1), the state board of education shall  
25 require that the program annually develop and implement a plan to  
26 increase the level of collaboration and interaction between the  
27 program's faculty and K-12 schools in the state. The plan shall  
28 require, to the maximum extent feasible, that each member of the

1 faculty annually provide instruction in K-12 classrooms.
