

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8400

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By Senators Bailey, Rinehart, Erwin, Murray, Oke and Skratek.

Read first time January 24, 1991. Referred to Committee on Education.

1 WHEREAS, The Education Vision Team comprised of leaders in
2 education, parent advocacy, state government, and business have
3 developed an educational vision statement entitled, "VISION: EDUCATION
4 2001"; and

5 WHEREAS, The education vision statement is intended to be an
6 evolving, dynamic document reflecting the state's commitment to
7 educational renewal and improvement as the twenty-first century
8 approaches; and

9 WHEREAS, State and local educational policies and programs should
10 be aimed at realizing the vision statement; and

11 WHEREAS, The vision statement has been endorsed by Governor Booth
12 Gardner, Superintendent of Public Instruction Judith Billings, the
13 State Board of Education, the Washington State School Directors'
14 Association, the Washington Association of School Administrators, the
15 Association of Washington School Principals, the Washington Education
16 Association, the Washington State PTA, and the Washington Roundtable;

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of
2 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That the VISION:
3 EDUCATION 2001 statement is hereby endorsed as the guiding vision for
4 continuing efforts to establish by the year 2001 that, "The education
5 system in Washington state is world class because ALL students are
6 successful learners and responsible citizens"; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate distribute
8 copies of this resolution to Governor Booth Gardner, Superintendent of
9 Public Instruction Judith Billings, the State Board of Education, the
10 Washington State School Directors' Association, the Washington
11 Association of School Administrators, the Association of Washington
12 School Principals, the Washington Education Association, the Washington
13 State PTA, the Washington Roundtable, and the citizens of Washington
14 through the major news media of the state.
