1 AN ACT Relating to enforcement of cigarette and tobacco statutes;
2 amending RCW 66.28.090, 66.44.010, 66.44.370, 82.24.010, 82.24.027,
3 82.24.030, 82.24.040, 82.24.050, 82.24.070, 82.24.090, 82.24.110,
4 82.24.120, 82.24.130, 82.24.135, 82.24.145, 82.24.180, 82.24.190,
5 82.24.210, 82.24.230, 82.24.250, 82.24.510, 82.24.520, 82.24.550,
6 82.24.560, 82.26.010, 82.26.050, 82.26.060, 82.26.080, 82.26.090,
7 82.26.110, and 82.26.120; adding a new section to chapter 82.24 RCW;
8 adding a new section to chapter 82.26 RCW; adding a new section to
9 chapter 82.32 RCW; creating new sections; repealing RCW 82.24.260;
10 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

12 **Sec. 1.** RCW 66.28.090 and 1981 1st ex.s. c 5 s 20 are each amended
13 to read as follows:

14 (1) All licensed premises used in the manufacture, storage, or sale
15 of liquor, or any premises or parts of premises used or in any way

1 connected, physically or otherwise, with the licensed business, and/or
2 any premises where a banquet permit has been granted, shall at all
3 times be open to inspection by any liquor and tobacco enforcement
4 officer, inspector, or peace officer.

5 (2) Every person, being on any such premises and having charge
6 thereof, who refuses or fails to admit a liquor and tobacco enforcement
7 officer, inspector, or peace officer demanding to enter therein in
8 pursuance of this section in the execution of ((his/her)) his or her
9 duty, or who obstructs or attempts to obstruct the entry of such liquor
10 and tobacco enforcement officer, inspector, or officer of the peace, or
11 who refuses to allow a liquor and tobacco enforcement officer, and/or
12 an inspector to examine the books of the licensee, or who refuses or
13 neglects to make any return required by this title or the
14 ((regulations)) rules, shall be guilty of a violation of this title.

15 **Sec. 2.** RCW 66.44.010 and 1987 c 202 s 224 are each amended to
16 read as follows:

17 (1) All county and municipal peace officers are hereby charged with
18 the duty of investigating and prosecuting all violations of this title,
19 and the penal laws of this state relating to the manufacture,
20 importation, transportation, possession, distribution, and sale of
21 liquor, and all fines imposed for violations of this title and the
22 penal laws of this state relating to the manufacture, importation,
23 transportation, possession, distribution, and sale of liquor shall
24 belong to the county, city, or town wherein the court imposing the fine
25 is located, and shall be placed in the general fund for payment of the
26 salaries of those engaged in the enforcement of the provisions of this
27 title and the penal laws of this state relating to the manufacture,
28 importation, transportation, possession, distribution, and sale of
29 liquor: PROVIDED, That all fees, fines, forfeitures, and penalties

1 collected or assessed by a district court because of the violation of
2 a state law shall be remitted as provided in chapter 3.62 RCW as now
3 exists or is later amended.

4 (2) In addition to any and all other powers granted, the board
5 shall have the power to enforce the penal provisions of this title and
6 the penal laws of this state relating to the manufacture, importation,
7 transportation, possession, distribution, and sale of liquor.

8 (3) In addition to the other duties under this section, the board
9 shall enforce chapters 82.24 and 82.26 RCW.

10 (4) The board may appoint and employ, assign to duty and fix the
11 compensation of, officers to be designated as liquor and tobacco
12 enforcement officers. Such (~~liquor~~) enforcement officers shall have
13 the power, under the supervision of the board, to enforce the penal
14 provisions of this title and the penal laws of this state relating to
15 the manufacture, importation, transportation, possession, distribution,
16 and sale of liquor, and the provisions of chapters 82.24 and 82.26 RCW
17 relating to cigarettes and tobacco. They shall have the power and
18 authority to serve and execute all warrants and process of law issued
19 by the courts in enforcing the penal provisions of this title or of any
20 penal law of this state relating to the manufacture, importation,
21 transportation, possession, distribution, and sale of liquor, and the
22 provisions of chapters 82.24 and 82.26 RCW relating to cigarettes and
23 tobacco. They shall have the power to arrest without a warrant any
24 person or persons found in the act of violating any of the penal
25 provisions of this title or of any penal law of this state relating to
26 the manufacture, importation, transportation, possession, distribution,
27 and sale of liquor, and the provisions of chapters 82.24 and 82.26 RCW
28 relating to cigarettes and tobacco.

1 (5) The board shall make a special effort to enforce laws that
2 protect children and young adults from the harmful effects of tobacco
3 and alcohol consumption.

4 **Sec. 3.** RCW 66.44.370 and 1981 1st ex.s. c 5 s 27 are each amended
5 to read as follows:

6 No person shall knowingly or willfully resist or oppose any state,
7 county, or municipal peace officer, or liquor and tobacco enforcement
8 officer, in the discharge of ((his/her)) his or her duties under Title
9 66 RCW, or aid and abet such resistance or opposition. Any person who
10 violates this section shall be guilty of a violation of this title and
11 subject to arrest by any such officer.

12 **Sec. 4.** RCW 82.24.010 and 1961 c 15 s 82.24.010 are each amended
13 to read as follows:

14 For the purposes of this chapter, unless otherwise required by the
15 context:

16 (1) "Wholesaler" means every person who purchases, sells, or
17 distributes any one or more of the articles taxed herein to retailers
18 for the purpose of resale only;

19 (2) "Retailer" means every person, other than a wholesaler, who
20 purchases, sells, offers for sale, or distributes any one or more of
21 the articles taxed herein, irrespective of quantity or amount, or the
22 number of sales, and all persons operating under a retailer's
23 registration certificate;

24 (3) (~~"Retail selling price" means the ordinary, customary or usual~~
25 ~~price paid by the consumer for each package of cigarettes, the tax~~
26 ~~levied by this chapter and tax levied by this state;~~

27 ~~(4))~~ "Cigarette" means any roll for smoking made wholly or in part
28 of tobacco, irrespective of size or shape and irrespective of the

1 tobacco being flavored, adulterated, or mixed with any other
2 ingredient, where such roll has a wrapper or cover made of paper or any
3 material, except where such wrapper is wholly or in the greater part
4 made of natural leaf tobacco in its natural state;

5 ~~((5))~~ (4) "Stamp" means the stamp or stamps or meter impressions
6 by use of which the tax levy under this chapter is paid;

7 (5) "Board" means the liquor control board;

8 (6) The meaning attributed, in chapter 82.04 RCW, to the words
9 "person," "sale," "business," and "successor" shall apply equally in
10 the provisions of this chapter.

11 **Sec. 5.** RCW 82.24.027 and 1986 c 3 s 12 are each amended to read
12 as follows:

13 There is hereby levied and there shall be collected by the
14 ~~((department of revenue))~~ board from the persons mentioned in and in
15 the manner provided by this chapter, an additional tax upon the sale,
16 use, consumption, handling, possession, or distribution of cigarettes
17 in an amount equal to the rate of four mills per cigarette.

18 The moneys collected under this section shall be deposited in the
19 water quality account under RCW 70.146.030 through June 30, 2021, and
20 in the general fund thereafter.

21 **Sec. 6.** RCW 82.24.030 and 1990 c 216 s 1 are each amended to read
22 as follows:

23 In order to enforce collection of the tax hereby levied, the
24 ~~((department of revenue))~~ board shall design and have printed stamps of
25 such size and denominations as may be determined by the ~~((department))~~
26 board, such stamps to be affixed on the smallest container or package
27 that will be handled, sold, used, consumed, or distributed, to permit
28 the ~~((department))~~ board to readily ascertain by inspection, whether or

1 not such tax has been paid. Except as otherwise provided in this
2 chapter, every person shall cause to be affixed on every package of
3 cigarettes, stamps of an amount equaling the tax due thereon before he
4 or she sells, offers for sale, uses, consumes, handles, removes, or
5 otherwise disturbs and distributes the same: PROVIDED, That where it
6 is established to the satisfaction of the ((department)) board that it
7 is impractical to affix such stamps to the smallest container or
8 package, the ((department)) board may authorize the affixing of stamps
9 of appropriate denomination to a large container or package.

10 The ((department)) board may authorize the use of meter stamping
11 machines for imprinting stamps, which imprinted stamps shall be in lieu
12 of those otherwise provided for under this chapter, and if such use is
13 authorized, shall provide reasonable rules ((and regulations)) with
14 respect thereto.

15 **Sec. 7.** RCW 82.24.040 and 1990 c 216 s 2 are each amended to read
16 as follows:

17 No wholesaler in this state may possess within this state unstamped
18 cigarettes except that:

19 (1) Every wholesaler in the state who is licensed under Washington
20 state law may possess within this state unstamped cigarettes for such
21 period of time after receipt as is reasonably necessary to affix the
22 stamps as required; and

23 (2) Any wholesaler in the state who is licensed under Washington
24 state law and who furnishes a surety bond in a sum satisfactory to the
25 ((department)) board, shall be permitted to set aside, without affixing
26 the stamps required by this chapter, such part of ((his)) the
27 wholesaler's stock as may be necessary for the conduct of ((his)) the
28 wholesaler's business in making sales to persons in another state or
29 foreign country, to instrumentalities of the federal government, or to

1 the established governing bodies of any Indian tribe, recognized as
2 such by the United States Department of the Interior. Such unstamped
3 stock shall be kept separate and apart from stamped stock.

4 (3) Every wholesaler licensed under Washington state law shall, at
5 the time of shipping or delivering any of the articles taxed herein to
6 a point outside of this state, or to a federal instrumentality, or to
7 an Indian tribal organization, make a true duplicate invoice of the
8 same which shall show full and complete details of the sale or
9 delivery, whether or not stamps were affixed thereto, and shall
10 transmit such true duplicate invoice to the main office of the
11 ((department)) board, at Olympia, not later than the fifteenth day of
12 the following calendar month, and for failure to comply with the
13 requirements of this section the ((department)) board may revoke the
14 permission granted to the taxpayer to maintain a stock of goods to
15 which the stamps required by this chapter have not been affixed. The
16 ((department)) board may also revoke this permission to maintain a
17 stock of unstamped goods for sale to a specific Indian tribal
18 organization when it appears that sales of unstamped cigarettes to
19 persons who are not enrolled members of a recognized Indian tribe are
20 taking place, or have taken place, within the exterior boundaries of
21 the reservation occupied by that tribe.

22 **Sec. 8.** RCW 82.24.050 and 1990 c 216 s 3 are each amended to read
23 as follows:

24 ((No)) Every retailer ((in this state may possess unstamped
25 cigarettes within this state unless the retailer is licensed under
26 Washington state law and, within a period of time after receipt of any
27 of the articles taxed herein as is reasonably necessary for the
28 purpose, causes the same to have the requisite denomination and amount
29 of stamps affixed to represent the tax imposed herein: PROVIDED, That

1 ~~those articles to which stamps have been properly affixed by a~~
2 ~~wholesaler or another retailer, licensed under Washington state law,~~
3 ~~may be retained by any retailer, and that those articles intended for~~
4 ~~sale to qualified purchasers may, under rules adopted by the department~~
5 ~~of revenue, be retained by federal instrumentalities and Indian tribal~~
6 ~~organizations, without affixing the stamps required by this chapter))~~
7 shall purchase cigarettes with the stamps affixed.

8 **Sec. 9.** RCW 82.24.070 and 1987 c 496 s 5 are each amended to read
9 as follows:

10 Wholesalers ((~~and retailers~~)) subject to the provisions of this
11 chapter shall be allowed compensation for their services in affixing
12 the stamps herein required a sum computed at the rate of four dollars
13 per one thousand stamps purchased or affixed by them.

14 **Sec. 10.** RCW 82.24.090 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 278 s 62 are each
15 amended to read as follows:

16 Every wholesaler or retailer subject to the provisions of this
17 chapter shall keep and preserve for a period of five years an accurate
18 set of records, showing all transactions had with reference to the
19 purchase and sale of any of the articles taxed herein and such persons
20 shall also keep separately all invoices, and shall keep a record of all
21 stamps purchased, and all such records and all stock of taxable
22 articles on hand shall be open to inspection at all reasonable times by
23 the ((~~department of revenue~~)) board or its duly authorized agent.

24 All wholesalers shall within fifteen days after the first day of
25 each month file with the ((~~department of revenue~~)) board a report of
26 all drop shipment sales made by them to retailers within this state
27 during the preceding month, which report shall show the name and

1 address of the retailer to whom the cigarettes were sold, the kind and
2 quantity, and the date of delivery thereof.

3 **Sec. 11.** RCW 82.24.110 and 1990 c 216 s 4 are each amended to read
4 as follows:

5 (1) Each of the following acts is a gross misdemeanor and
6 punishable as such:

7 (a) To sell, except as a licensed wholesaler or licensed retailer
8 engaged in interstate commerce as to the article being taxed herein,
9 without the stamp first being affixed;

10 (b) To use or have in possession knowingly or intentionally any
11 forged or counterfeit stamps;

12 (c) For any person other than the (~~department of revenue~~) board
13 or its duly authorized agent to sell any stamps not affixed to any of
14 the articles taxed herein whether such stamps are genuine or
15 counterfeit;

16 (d) To violate any of the provisions of this chapter;

17 (e) To violate any lawful rule (~~or regulation~~) made and published
18 by the (~~department of revenue~~) board;

19 (f) To use any stamps more than once;

20 (g) To refuse to allow the (~~department of revenue~~) board or any
21 duly authorized agent thereof, on demand, to make full inspection of
22 any place of business where any of the articles herein taxed are sold
23 or otherwise hinder or prevent such inspection;

24 (h) For any retailer(~~(, except one permitted to maintain an~~
25 ~~unstamped stock to engage in interstate business as provided herein,)~~)
26 to have in possession in any place of business any of the articles
27 herein taxed, unless the same have the proper stamps attached;

28 (i) For any person to make, use, or present or exhibit to the
29 (~~department of revenue~~) board or any duly authorized agent thereof,

1 any invoice for any of the articles herein taxed which bears an untrue
2 date or falsely states the nature or quantity of the goods therein
3 invoiced;

4 (j) For any wholesaler or retailer or (~~his or her~~) its agents or
5 employees to fail to produce on demand of the (~~department of revenue~~)
6 board all invoices of all the articles herein taxed or stamps bought
7 (~~by him or her~~) or received in (~~his or her~~) its place of business
8 within five years prior to such demand unless (~~he or she~~) the
9 wholesaler or retailer can show by satisfactory proof that the
10 nonproduction of the invoices was due to causes beyond (~~his~~) its
11 control;

12 (k) For any person to receive in this state any shipment of any of
13 the articles taxed herein, when the same are not stamped, are untaxed,
14 or are untaxed and stamped for the purpose of avoiding payment of tax.
15 It is presumed that persons other than dealers who purchase or receive
16 shipments of unstamped, untaxed, or untaxed stamped cigarettes do so to
17 avoid payment of the tax imposed herein;

18 (l) For any person to possess or transport upon the public
19 highways, roads, or streets of this state a quantity of sixty thousand
20 cigarettes or less (~~unless the proper stamps required by this chapter~~
21 ~~have been affixed~~) that are unstamped, untaxed, or untaxed stamped
22 cigarettes or unless the person transporting the cigarettes has in
23 actual possession invoices or delivery tickets therefor which show the
24 true name and address of the consignor or seller, the true name of the
25 consignee or purchaser, and the quantity and brands of the cigarettes
26 so transported and unless the cigarettes are consigned to or purchased
27 by any person in this state who is a purchaser or consignee authorized
28 by this chapter to possess unstamped, untaxed, or untaxed stamped
29 cigarettes in this state.

1 (2) It is unlawful for any person knowingly or intentionally to
2 possess or to transport upon the public highways, roads, or streets of
3 this state a quantity in excess of sixty thousand cigarettes ((unless
4 the proper stamps required by this chapter are affixed thereto or))
5 that are unstamped, untaxed, or untaxed stamped cigarettes unless the
6 person transporting the cigarettes actually possesses invoices or
7 delivery tickets showing the true name and address of the consignor or
8 seller, the true name of the consignee or purchaser, and the quantity
9 and brands of the cigarettes so transported. Violation of this section
10 shall be punished as a class C felony under Title 9A RCW.

11 (3) All agents, employees, and others who aid, abet, or otherwise
12 participate in any way in the violation of the provisions of this
13 chapter or in any of the offenses described in this chapter shall be
14 guilty and punishable as principals, to the same extent as any
15 wholesaler or retailer or any other person violating the provisions
16 thereof.

17 **Sec. 12.** RCW 82.24.120 and 1990 c 267 s 1 are each amended to read
18 as follows:

19 If any person, subject to the provisions of this chapter or any
20 rules ((and regulations)) promulgated by the ((department of revenue))
21 board under authority hereof, is found to have failed to affix the
22 stamps required, or to have them affixed as herein provided, or to pay
23 any tax due hereunder, or to have violated any of the provisions of
24 this chapter or rules ((and regulations)) promulgated by the
25 ((department of revenue)) board in the administration hereof, there
26 shall be assessed and collected from such person, in addition to any
27 tax that may be found due, a penalty equal to the greater of ten
28 dollars per package of unstamped cigarettes or two hundred fifty
29 dollars, plus interest thereon at the rate of one percent for each

1 thirty days or portions thereof from the date the tax became due, and
2 upon notice mailed to the last known address of the person said amount
3 shall become due and payable in ten days, at which time the
4 ((department)) board or its duly authorized agent may make immediate
5 demand upon such person for the payment of all such taxes and
6 penalties. The ((department)) board, for good reason shown, may remit
7 all or any part of penalties imposed, but the taxpayer must pay all
8 taxes due and interest thereon, at the rate of one percent for each
9 thirty days or portion thereof. The keeping of any unstamped, untaxed,
10 or untaxed stamped articles coming within the provisions of this
11 chapter shall be prima facie evidence of intent to violate the
12 provisions of this chapter.

13 **Sec. 13.** RCW 82.24.130 and 1990 c 216 s 5 are each amended to read
14 as follows:

15 (1) The following are subject to seizure and forfeiture:

16 (a) Subject to RCW 82.24.250, any articles taxed in this chapter
17 that are found at any point within this state, which articles are held,
18 owned, or possessed by any person, and that ((do not have the stamps
19 affixed to the packages or containers)) are unstamped, untaxed, or
20 untaxed and stamped.

21 (b) All conveyances, including aircraft, vehicles, or vessels,
22 which are used, or intended for use, to transport, or in any manner to
23 facilitate the transportation, for the purpose of sale or receipt of
24 property described in (a) of this subsection, except:

25 (i) A conveyance used by any person as a common or contract carrier
26 having in actual possession invoices or delivery tickets showing the
27 true name and address of the consignor or seller, the true name of the
28 consignee or purchaser, and the quantity and brands of the cigarettes
29 transported, unless it appears that the owner or other person in charge

1 of the conveyance is a consenting party or privy to a violation of this
2 chapter;

3 (ii) A conveyance subject to forfeiture under this section by
4 reason of any act or omission of which the owner thereof establishes to
5 have been committed or omitted without his or her knowledge or consent;

6 (iii) A conveyance encumbered by a bona fide security interest if
7 the secured party neither had knowledge of nor consented to the act or
8 omission.

9 (c) Any vending machine used for the purpose of violating the
10 provisions of this chapter.

11 (2) Property subject to forfeiture under this chapter may be seized
12 by any agent of the ((department)) board authorized to collect taxes or
13 law enforcement officer of this state upon process issued by any
14 superior court or district court having jurisdiction over the property.
15 Seizure without process may be made if:

16 (a) The seizure is incident to an arrest or a search under a search
17 warrant or an inspection under an administrative inspection warrant; or

18 (b) The ((department)) board or law enforcement officer has
19 probable cause to believe that the property was used or is intended to
20 be used in violation of this chapter and exigent circumstances exist
21 making procurement of a search warrant impracticable.

22 (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section,
23 articles taxed in this chapter which are in the possession of a
24 wholesaler ((or retailer)), licensed under Washington state law, for a
25 period of time necessary to affix the stamps after receipt of the
26 articles, shall not be considered contraband.

27 **Sec. 14.** RCW 82.24.135 and 1987 c 496 s 3 are each amended to read
28 as follows:

1 In all cases of seizure of any property made subject to forfeiture
2 under this chapter the ((department)) board shall proceed as follows:

3 (1) Forfeiture shall be deemed to have commenced by the seizure.
4 Notice of seizure shall be given to the ((department)) board
5 immediately if the seizure is made by someone other than an agent of
6 the ((department)) board authorized to collect taxes.

7 (2) Upon notification or seizure by the ((department)) board or
8 upon receipt of property subject to forfeiture under this chapter from
9 any other person, the ((department)) board shall list and particularly
10 describe the property seized in duplicate and have the property
11 appraised by a qualified person not employed by the ((department))
12 board or acting as its agent. Listing and appraisal of the property
13 shall be properly attested by the ((department)) board and the
14 appraiser, who shall be allowed a reasonable appraisal fee. No
15 appraisal is required if the property seized is judged by the
16 ((department)) board to be less than one hundred dollars in value.

17 (3) The ((department)) board shall cause notice to be served within
18 five days following the seizure or notification to the ((department))
19 board of the seizure on the owner of the property seized, if known, on
20 the person in charge thereof, and on any other person having any known
21 right or interest therein, of the seizure and intended forfeiture of
22 the seized property. The notice may be served by any method authorized
23 by law or court rule including but not limited to service by mail. If
24 service is by mail it shall be by both certified mail with return
25 receipt requested and regular mail. Service by mail shall be deemed
26 complete upon mailing within the five-day period following the seizure
27 or notification of the seizure to the ((department)) board.

28 (4) If no person notifies the ((department)) board in writing of
29 the person's claim of ownership or right to possession of the items

1 seized within fifteen days of the date of the notice of seizure, the
2 item seized shall be considered forfeited.

3 (5) If any person notifies the ((department)) board, in writing, of
4 the person's claim of ownership or right to possession of the items
5 seized within fifteen days of the date of the notice of seizure, the
6 person or persons shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity to be
7 heard as to the claim or right. The hearing shall be before the
8 ((director)) board or the ((director's)) board's designee, except that
9 any person asserting a claim or right may bring an action for return of
10 the seized items in the superior court of the county in which such
11 property was seized, if the aggregate value of the article or articles
12 involved is more than five hundred dollars. A hearing before the
13 seizing agency and any appeal therefrom shall be in accordance with
14 chapter 34.05 RCW. The burden of proof by a preponderance of the
15 evidence shall be upon the person claiming to be the lawful owner or
16 the person claiming to have the lawful right to possession of the items
17 seized. The ((department)) board shall promptly return the article or
18 articles to the claimant upon a determination that the claimant is the
19 present lawful owner or is lawfully entitled to possession thereof of
20 the items seized.

21 **Sec. 15.** RCW 82.24.145 and 1987 c 496 s 4 are each amended to read
22 as follows:

23 When property is forfeited under this chapter the ((department))
24 board may:

25 (1) Retain the property or any part thereof for official use or
26 upon application by any law enforcement agency of this state, another
27 state, or the District of Columbia, or of the United States for the
28 exclusive use of enforcing the provisions of this chapter or the laws
29 of any other state or the District of Columbia or of the United States.

1 (2) Sell the property at public auction to the highest bidder after
2 due advertisement, but the ((department)) board before delivering any
3 of the goods so seized shall require the person to whom the property is
4 sold to affix the proper amount of stamps. The proceeds of the sale
5 and all moneys forfeited under this chapter shall be first applied to
6 the payment of all proper expenses of any investigation leading to the
7 seizure and of the proceedings for forfeiture and sale, including
8 expenses of seizure, maintenance of custody, advertising, and court
