1 AN ACT Relating to pension payments to retired teachers; amending  
2 RCW 41.32.570; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that there is a  
5 shortage of certificated substitute teachers in many regions of the  
6 state, and that this shortage will likely increase in the coming years.  
7 The legislature further finds that one method of reducing this shortage  
8 of substitute teachers is to encourage retired teachers to serve as  
9 substitutes by increasing the number of days they can work without  
10 affecting their retirement payments.

11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 41.32.570 and 1989 c 273 s 29 are each amended to read  
12 as follows:

13 (1) Any retired teacher who enters service in any public  
14 educational institution in Washington state shall cease to receive  
15 pension payments while engaged in such service: PROVIDED, That service  
16 may be rendered up to seventy-five days per school year without  
17 reduction of pension.

1       (2) In addition to the seventy-five days of service permitted under  
2 subsection (1) of this section, a retired teacher may also serve only  
3 as a substitute teacher for up to an additional fifteen days per school  
4 year without reduction of pension, subject to the conditions in  
5 subsection (3) of this section.

6       (3) If a school district or multidistrict substitute cooperative  
7 determines it has a shortage of certificated substitute teachers it  
8 can, by resolution adopted by the school board or cooperative board,  
9 elect to make its substitute teachers who are retired teachers eligible  
10 for the extended service permitted by subsection (2) of this section.  
11 The resolution shall state that the board or cooperative board finds  
12 there to be a shortage of certificated substitute teachers and that the  
13 services of retired teachers are necessary to address the shortage.  
14 The district or cooperative board shall forward a copy of the  
15 resolution with a list of retired teachers who have been employed as  
16 substitute teachers to the department. Upon supplying the department  
17 with a copy of the resolution and the list, the district or cooperative  
18 board may notify the retired teachers included on the list of their  
19 right to take advantage of the provisions of subsection (2) of this  
20 section.

21       (4) Subsection (1) of this section shall apply to all persons  
22 governed by the provisions of plan I, regardless of the date of their  
23 retirement, but shall apply only to benefits payable after June 11,  
24 1986.

25       (5) Subsections (2) and (3) of this section shall apply to all  
26 persons governed by the provisions of plan I, regardless of the date of  
27 their retirement, but shall only apply to benefits payable after  
28 September 1, 1993.

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
