1 AN ACT Relating to exempting from prevailing rate requirements
2 donated services; and amending RCW 39.12.020.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 39.12.020 and 1989 c 12 s 7 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 The hourly wages to be paid to laborers, workers, or mechanics,
7 upon all public works and under all public building service maintenance
8 contracts of the state or any county, municipality or political
9 subdivision created by its laws, shall be not less than the prevailing
10 rate of wage for an hour's work in the same trade or occupation in the
11 locality within the state where such labor is performed. For a
12 contract in excess of ten thousand dollars, a contractor required to
13 pay the prevailing rate of wage shall post in a location readily
14 visible to workers at the job site: PROVIDED, That on road
15 construction, sewer line, pipeline, transmission line, street, or alley
16 improvement projects for which no field office is needed or
17 established, a contractor may post the prevailing rate of wage
18 statement at the contractor's local office, gravel crushing, concrete,

1 or asphalt batch plant as long as the contractor provides a copy of the
2 wage statement to any employee on request:

3 (1) A copy of a statement of intent to pay prevailing wages
4 approved by the industrial statistician of the department of labor and
5 industries under RCW 39.12.040; and

6 (2) The address and telephone number of the industrial statistician
7 of the department of labor and industries where a complaint or inquiry
8 concerning prevailing wages may be made.

9 This chapter shall not apply to: Workers or other persons
10 regularly employed on monthly or per diem salary by the state, or any
11 county, municipality, or political subdivision created by its laws; or
12 public works contracts with the state, or any county, municipality, or
13 political subdivision created by its laws in which the contractor
14 agrees to fully donate the services specified in the contract.
