The legislature finds that the high and 5 rising cost of housing inmates in prison has placed an extreme б burden on taxpayers. The legislature further finds that building 7 new prisons and expanding existing prison facilities should not be the only option considered for dealing with prison overcrowding. 8 Serious consideration should also be given to lower cost facility 9 efficiency use options such as "hot bunking" that allows prison 10 11 beds to be used on a scheduled rotation basis. Under a "hot 12 bunking" policy, inmates would be prohibited from spending more 13 than twelve hours per day in their cell. The remaining hours would be spent away from the cell engaged in other activities, freeing up 14 the cell for use by other inmates. 15

16 The department of corrections shall review the concept of "hot 17 bunking" and analyze how a policy of "hot bunking" can be 18 implemented. The department shall make recommendations on "hot 19 bunking" by December 12, 1995, to the appropriate committees of the 20 house of representatives and the senate."
