- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 510. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.** This act is necessary
- 26 for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety,
- 27 or support of the state government and its existing public
- 28 institutions, and shall take effect July 1, 1995.
