5 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 6 following:

7 "Sec. 1. RCW 28B.15.620 and 1994 c 208 s 1 are each amended to 8 read as follows:

(1) The legislature finds that military and naval veterans who have 9 served their country in wars on foreign soil have risked their own 10 lives to defend both the lives of all Americans and the freedoms that 11 define and distinguish our nation. The legislature also finds that 12 veterans of the Vietnam conflict suffered during and after the war as 13 the country anguished over its involvement in the conflict. It is the 14 15 intent of the legislature to honor Vietnam veterans for the public 16 service they have provided to their country. It is the further intent of the legislature that, for eligible Vietnam veterans, colleges and 17 universities waive tuition and fee increases that have occurred since 18 October 1, 1977. 19

(2) Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, the governing 20 21 boards of the state universities, the regional universities, The 22 Evergreen State College, and the community colleges may exempt veterans 23 of the Vietnam conflict who have served in the southeast Asia theater of operations from the payment of all or a portion of any increase in 24 25 tuition and fees that occur after October 1, 1977, if the veteran qualifies as a resident student under RCW 28B.15.012((, was enrolled in 26 27 state institutions of higher education on or before May 7, 1990, and meets the requirements of subsection (2) of this section. 28

29 (2) Beginning with the fall academic term of 1994, veterans 30 receiving the exemption under subsection (1) of this section must meet 31 these additional requirements:

32 (a) Remain continuously enrolled for seven or more quarter credits 33 per academic term or their equivalent, except summer term and not 34 including community service courses;

35 (b) Have an adjusted gross family income as most recently reported
 36 to the internal revenue service that does not exceed Washington state's

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1 median family income as established by the federal bureau of the

2 census; and

(c) Have exhausted all entitlement to federal vocational or 3 4 educational benefits conferred by virtue of their military service)). Institutions shall give priority in granting the waivers to any veteran 5 defined under this section who could have qualified as a Washington 6 7 resident student under RCW 28B.15.012(2) had he or she been enrolled as a student at the time he or she entered military or naval service. In 8 9 addition, to receive a tuition and fees waiver under this subsection, 10 the veteran must have an adjusted gross family income as most recently reported to the federal internal revenue service that is lower than 11 Washington state's median family income as established by the federal 12 13 bureau of the census.

14 (3) For the purposes of this section, "veterans of the Vietnam 15 conflict" shall be those persons who have been on active federal 16 service as a member of the armed military or ((navel)) <u>naval</u> forces of 17 the United States between a period commencing August 5, 1964, and 18 ending on May 7, 1975.

19 (4) This section shall expire June 30, ((1997)) <u>1999</u>."
