- 2 creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature is interested in improving
- 5 the selective fishing capabilities of the state's salmon fisheries. In
- 6 order to better understand how this goal can be accomplished, the
- 7 department of fish and wildlife shall prepare a report detailing the
- 8 selective fishing capabilities of existing types of commercial and
- 9 recreational salmon fishing gear and of current fishing techniques.
- 10 The report shall also include information on alternative types of
- 11 fishing gear and fishing techniques. The department shall seek input
- 12 from commercial, recreational, and tribal fishing interests in
- 13 preparing the report. The report shall be submitted to the appropriate
- 14 legislative committees by December 31, 1998.
