- 3 PRESIDENT PRO TEM OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE SENATE, ROBERT HERTZBERG,
- 4 SPEAKER OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE ASSEMBLY, MEMBERS OF THE CALIFORNIA
- 5 STATE SENATE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, UTILITIES, & COMMUNICATIONS, AND TO
- 6 MEMBERS OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON ENERGY COSTS AND
- 7 AVAILABILITY:
- 8 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 9 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 10 represent and petition as follows:
- 11 WHEREAS, The California energy crisis, brought on in significant
- 12 part by the restructuring of the California retail electricity market,
- 13 has caused wholesale power prices throughout the western United States
- 14 to increase dramatically; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Unprecedented increases in wholesale power costs have put
- 16 tremendous financial strain on Washington utilities that rely, to
- 17 varying degrees, on the wholesale market to serve Washington consumers;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, Several Washington electric and gas utilities have
- 20 responded to this situation by adopting significant rate increases,
- 21 ranging on average from thirty to sixty percent for residential

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- 1 customers and even higher increases for commercial and industrial
- 2 customers, in an effort to maintain their financial stability; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The federal Department of Energy has issued emergency
- 4 orders requiring certain Washington utilities to sell surplus power to
- 5 California without providing any assurance of repayment, through either
- 6 federal or state guarantees on the purchases made by financially
- 7 unstable California utilities; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The California Public Utilities Commission has approved
- 9 temporary rate increases of one cent per kilowatt hour for customers of
- 10 Pacific Gas & Electric Company and Southern California Edison Company;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, These temporary increases equate to approximately nine
- 13 percent for California residential customers, seven percent for small
- 14 business customers, twelve percent for medium business customers, and
- 15 fifteen percent for large commercial and industrial customers; and
- 16 WHEREAS, It is just and reasonable to require additional rate
- 17 increases for the customers of Pacific Gas & Electric Company and
- 18 Southern California Edison Company in order to increase the likelihood
- 19 of their ability to repay Washington utilities; and
- 20 WHEREAS, It is fair and equitable for the state of California to
- 21 provide a payment guarantee on behalf of Pacific Gas & Electric Company
- 22 and Southern California Edison Company for any purchases made by them
- 23 from Washington utilities as a result of the Department of Energy
- 24 emergency orders;
- 25 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the state
- 26 of California require rate increases for California utility customers
- 27 to guarantee payment for the power it receives from Washington state.
- 28 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 29 transmitted to the Honorable Gray Davis, Governor of California,
- 30 Loretta Lynch, President of the California Public Utilities Commission,
- 31 John Burton, President Pro Tem of the California State Senate, Robert

- 34 Communications, and Members of the California State Assembly Committee
- 35 on Energy Costs and Availability.

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
