- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES,
- 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE
- 5 UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, Agriculture is the number one industry in the state of
- 10 Washington; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Irrigated agriculture is an essential portion of this
- 12 important source of jobs and revenue to the state of Washington and the
- 13 United States as a whole; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Proper maintenance of irrigation facilities, including the
- 15 responsible use of aquatic pesticides to keep waterways free of weeds,
- 16 is essential to their continued economic operation; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The recent Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals decision in
- 18 Headwaters Inc. v. Talent Irrigation District held that a National
- 19 Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit under the Clean
- 20 Water Act is needed prior to application of an aquatic herbicide in
- 21 irrigation canals; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Pesticide use is governed by the Federal Insecticide,
- 2 Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Pesticide applications are made in a diffuse fashion
- 4 across large areas of land or water; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Clean Water Act NPDES permit is intended to cover
- 6 point sources of discharge; and
- WHEREAS, Extension of the NPDES permit to pesticide applications,
- 8 especially for irrigation canal uses, would add unacceptable, onerous
- 9 levels of regulatory delay to the adequate maintenance of irrigation
- 10 districts;
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United
- 12 States Environmental Protection Agency be directed to immediately
- 13 clarify, and modify if necessary, the applicability of the Clean Water
- 14 Act to pesticide applications and provide relief to irrigation
- 15 districts for pesticide applications to be made this summer, and also
- 16 to take an active role in the current litigation on this subject before
- 17 the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.
- 18 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 19 transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United
- 20 States, and the Administrator of the United States Environmental
- 21 Protection Agency, the President of the United States Senate, the
- 22 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress
- 23 from the State of Washington.
