- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES,
- 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Washington state is one of the leading agricultural states
- 9 in the nation and has a vested interest in promoting and expanding its
- 10 agricultural market to Cuba; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Washington is the fourth largest exporting state of the
- 12 United States, ranking among the top ten states for thirty-five
- 13 separate commodities; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Washington state ranks twelfth in the nation for
- 15 agricultural products, accounting for approximately twenty-nine billion
- 16 dollars of this state's total economy; and
- 17 WHEREAS, There are currently not enough apple, wheat, and potato
- 18 markets in Washington state; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Washington state and Cuba have historical economic ties;

- 1 WHEREAS, Polling results have indicated that an overwhelming
- 2 majority of American people support the normalization of relations with
- 3 Cuba; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Representative George Nethercutt sponsored the Trade
- 5 Sanction Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000, 22 U.S.C. Sec.
- 6 7201-7209, P.L. 106-387, to liberalize United States sanctions on
- 7 exports of our agricultural commodities to Cuba; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Initial sales of agricultural commodities have been made
- 9 to Cuba, but continuing United States restrictions limit full access to
- 10 the Cuban market; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Lack of economic access with neighboring countries weakens
- 12 the agricultural market in Washington state; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Expanding agricultural trade will benefit both the people
- 14 of Cuba and America; and
- WHEREAS, The Senate and the House of Representatives of the state
- 16 of Washington are committed to working diligently toward the goal of
- 17 full normalization of relations between the United States of America
- 18 and the Republic of Cuba;
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully petition Congress
- 20 and the President of the United States to end the policy of
- 21 restrictions on trade with Cuba.
- 22 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 23 transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United
- 24 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 25 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 26 Washington.
