- 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, The 1972 Antiballistic Missile Treaty was signed with a
- 9 nation that no longer exists; and
- 10 WHEREAS, An increasing number of nations either currently possess
- 11 the capability to launch missile attacks against the United States or
- 12 are working to obtain that capability; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Due in part to advances in technology, the possibility
- 14 that a missile bearing a weapon of mass destruction will be used
- 15 against United States forces or interests is higher today than it was
- 16 during most of the Cold War; and
- WHEREAS, Terrorist groups, not just states, may have the means to
- 18 buy intercontinental ballistic missiles; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The nation still has no defense against missile attack;

1 WHEREAS, The Cold War policy of "mutual assured destruction" 2 assumed in arms control treaties is not sufficient to deter missile 3 attacks; and
