TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO A EACH MEMBER OF CONGRESS FROM THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent and petition as follows:

WHEREAS, In 1998, Congress enacted, and in 2001 extended, the Internet Tax Freedom Act to protect consumers who used the Internet and encourage more individuals to access the Internet; and

WHEREAS, The legislation eliminated taxes on Internet access, double-taxation of a product or service bought over the Internet, and discriminatory taxes that treated Internet purchases differently from other types of sales; and

14 WHEREAS, The moratorium on Internet access led to the rapid growth 15 of the Internet, which in turn brought good economic news; and

WHEREAS, We live in an age of innovation, where the medium of the Internet is sparking a sharp increase in entrepreneurship and opportunity, the likes of which have not been seen since the beginning of the Industrial Revolution;
