### **HB 1347**

**Brief Description:** Requiring emergency response plans for long-term care facilities.

**Sponsors:** Representatives Schual-Berke, Kagi, Morrell, Haigh, Green, Kessler, Cody, Appleton, Ormsby, Hunter, Kenney, O'Brien, Springer, Santos and Campbell.

#### **Brief Summary of Bill**

• Requires long-term care residential care facilities to have emergency response plans in place.

#### **Background:**

Nursing homes, adult family homes, and boarding homes are currently required to have emergency response places in place to deal with natural and man-made emergency situations. Only nursing homes are required to have emergency generator backup. There is currently no requirement that long-term care facilities coordinate their emergency response plans with local political subdivision emergency planning authorities.

#### **Summary of Bill:**

All long-term care residential care facilities are required to have emergency response plans in place. The emergency response plans will provide for an alternative source of power. Long-term care emergency response plans must be coordinated with local political subdivision emergency planning authorities.

**Appropriation:** None.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.
