• Allows payroll deductions for retiree organization dues.

Background:

Upon meeting some requirements as to the number of employees making the request, state employees can request payroll deductions for the following:

- credit union payments;
- parking fee payments;
- U.S. savings bond payments;
- deductions for board, lodging or uniforms, when furnished by the state;
- membership dues and other fees to professional organizations;
- insurance contributions for payment of premiums under contracts authorized by the state Health Care Authority;
- deductions to a bank, savings bank, or savings and loan association; and
- contributions to the Washington State Combined Fund Drive.

Deductions for labor or employee organization dues may be made if a payroll deduction is not provided under a collective bargaining agreement.
