## **Background:**

Traffic flaggers are sometimes used to provide traffic control when a construction or maintenance project impacts a traffic lane. Other methods used to control traffic include signs or using a pilot car to guide traffic through a work area.

## **Summary of Amended Bill:**

This analysis was prepared by non-partisan legislative staff for the use of legislative members in their deliberations. This analysis is not a part of the legislation nor does it constitute a statement of legislative intent.

The bill authorizes the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to undertake a pilot project to evaluate the use of electronic flagging devices. Testing must occur at multiple sites and the review must include safety and efficiency considerations. The WSDOT must submit a report of its recommendations to the Legislature by June 30, 2009. If the bill is not funded through the transportation appropriations act, the bill is null and void.

# Amended Bill Compared to Original Bill:

The amended bill deletes the \$100,000 appropriation and the bill is null and void if not referenced in the Transportation Budget. The amended bill also corrects a spelling error.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Available.

**Effective Date of Amended Bill:** The bill takes effect 90 days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed. However, the bill is null and void if not funded in the Transportation Budget.
