Background: The Gambling Commission (Commission) has the authority to license persons who: conduct or utilize bingo games, raffles, amusement games, social card games, punch boards, and pull-tabs, or sell gambling devices; or work for an operator of a gambling activity. The Commission may authorize the Director of the Commission to temporarily issue or suspend some, but not all, of these licenses.

Summary of Bill: The Commission may authorize the Director to temporarily issue or suspend licenses subject to final action by the Commission. This authorization includes licenses issued to: persons, associations, or organizations conducting amusement games; persons, associations, or organizations that sell, distribute, supply, or manufacture gambling devices; or persons who work for an operator of a gambling activity.

The Commission may renew the license of persons who are discharged from active military service if the person applies for renewal within six months of being honorably discharged, removed, or released from active military service.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Staff Summary of Public Testimony: PRO: This allows the director to issue individual gambling operator employees a temporary license rather than waiting for the license to be approved at a meeting of the Gambling Commission. This is the same authority that the Liquor Control Board and the Lottery Commission has.
