Background: The State Board of Education (SBE) has statutory authority to hire an executive director but the authorized duties of the executive director are not addressed.

Summary of Bill: By resolution, the SBE may delegate duties to the executive director that are necessary to carry on the business of the SBE.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Staff Summary of Public Testimony: PRO: The board has statutory authority to hire an executive director, but the duties of the executive director are not specified. This bill authorizes the SBE to delegate duties to the executive director, as necessary to carry out the duties of the board.
