- AN ACT Relating to paying utility bills electronically; adding a new section to chapter 35.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35.67 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 35.92 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 36.94 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 54.16 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 57.08 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 80.28 RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 80.36 RCW.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 9 to read as follows:
- (1) When a city or town that provides electric, natural gas, water, or sewer services substantially upgrades or replaces their billing system, the resulting system must be capable of accepting electronic payment from residential customers. Additional fees or costs charged to the customer may not exceed the actual cost of providing an electronic payment option. The methodology related to electronic payment shall not affect the terms and conditions of service.
