1 AN ACT Relating to contracts with associate development 2 organizations for economic development services; amending RCW 3 43.330.080; adding new sections to chapter 43.330 RCW; and creating new sections. 4

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that economic 7 development success requires coordinated state and local efforts. The 8 legislature further finds that economic development happens at the 9 local level. County designated associate development organizations 10 serve as a networking tool and resource hub for business retention, expansion, and relocation in Washington. Economic development success 11 requires an adequately funded and coordinated state effort and an 12 13 adequately funded and coordinated local effort. The legislature intends to bolster the partnership between state and local economic 14 15 development efforts, provide increased funding for local economic 16 development services, and increase local economic development service 17 effectiveness, efficiency, and outcomes.

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1 Sec. 2. RCW 43.330.080 and 1997 c 60 s 1 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 (((1))) The department shall contract with associate development organizations ((or other local organizations)) to increase the support 4 for and coordination of community and economic development services in 5 communities or regional areas. The organizations contracted with in 6 7 each community or regional area shall be broadly representative of 8 community and economic interests. The organization shall be capable of identifying key economic and community development problems, developing 9 10 appropriate solutions, and mobilizing broad support for recommended initiatives. The contracting organization shall work with and include 11 12 local governments, local chambers of commerce, ((private industry 13 councils,)) workforce development councils, port districts, labor groups, institutions of higher education, community action programs, 14 15 and other appropriate private, public, or nonprofit community and economic development groups. The ((department shall be responsible for 16 17 determining the)) scope of services delivered under these contracts((-18 (2) Associate development organizations or other local development organizations contracted with shall promote and coordinate, through 19 local service agreements with local governments, small business 20 21 development centers, port districts, community and technical colleges, 22 private industry councils, and other development organizations, for the efficient delivery of community and economic development services in 23

24 their areas.

(3) The department shall consult with associate development 25 26 organizations, port districts, local governments, and other local 27 development organizations in the establishment of service delivery regions throughout the state. The legislature encourages local 28 29 associate development organizations to form partnerships with other 30 associate development organizations in their region to combine resources for better access to available services, to encourage 31 regional delivery of state services, and to build the local capacity of 32 33 communities in the region more effectively.

34 (4) The department shall contract on a regional basis for surveys 35 of key sectors of the regional economy and the coordination of 36 technical assistance to businesses and employees within the key 37 sectors. The department's selection of contracting organizations or 38 consortiums shall be based on the sufficiency of the organization's or

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consortium's proposal to examine key sectors of the local economy 1 2 within its region adequately and its ability to coordinate the delivery of services required by businesses within the targeted sectors. 3 Organizations contracting with the department shall work closely with 4 the department to examine the local economy and to develop strategies 5 6 to focus on developing key sectors that show potential for long-term sustainable growth. The contracting organization shall survey 7 8 businesses and employees in targeted sectors on a periodic basis to gather information on the sector's business needs, expansion plans, 9 relocation decisions, training needs, potential layoffs, financing 10 11 needs, availability of financing, and other appropriate information 12 about economic trends and specific employer and employee needs in the 13 region. (5)) shall include two broad areas of work: 14

15 (1) Direct assistance, including business planning, to companies 16 who need support to stay in business, expand, or relocate to Washington 17 from out of state or other countries. Assistance includes:

18 (a) Acting as a conduit to partner organizations in workforce 19 development, ports, community college and higher education, small 20 business assistance programs particularly small business development 21 centers, and other federal, state, and local programs;

(b) Providing information on state and local permitting, tax issues, and other essential information for operating and expanding a business in Washington;

25 (c) Marketing Washington as an excellent location to expand or 26 relocate a business and positioning Washington as a globally 27 competitive place to grow business; and

28 (d) Developing and executing regional plans to attract companies
 29 from out of state and to increase direct foreign investment; and

30 (2) Support for regional economic research and regional planning 31 efforts to implement target industry strategies and other economic 32 development strategies that support increased living standards 33 throughout Washington. Activities include:

34 (a) Participation in regional planning efforts involving combined
 35 strategies around workforce development and economic development
 36 policies and programs. The contracting organization shall participate
 37 with the workforce training and education coordinating board as created

in chapter 28C.18 RCW, and any regional entities designated by that board, in providing for the coordination of job skills training within its region;

(b) Collecting and reporting local and regional economic 4 information to inform local, regional, and statewide strategic 5 decisions regarding business development policy and economic 6 7 development aspects of growth management act planning. In cooperation with other local, regional, and state planning efforts, contracting 8 organizations may provide insight into the needs of target industry 9 clusters, business expansion plans, early detection of potential 10 relocations or layoffs, training needs, and other appropriate economic 11 12 information.

13 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) Contracting associate development organizations shall provide the department with measures of their 14 performance. Annual reports shall include information on the impact of 15 16 the contracting organization on employment, wages, tax revenue, and 17 capital investment. Specific measures shall be developed in the contracting process between the department and the contracting 18 organization every two years. 19 Performance measures should be 20 consistent across regions to allow for statewide evaluation.

(2)(a) The department and contracting organizations shall agree upon specific target levels for the performance measures in subsection (1) of this section. Comparison of agreed thresholds and actual performance shall occur annually.

(b) Contracting organizations that fail to achieve the agreed performance targets in more than one-half of the agreed measures shall develop remediation plans to address performance gaps. The remediation plans shall include revised performance thresholds specifically chosen to provide evidence of progress in making the identified service changes.

31 (c) Contracts and state funding shall be terminated for one year for organizations that fail to achieve the agreed upon progress toward 32 improved performance defined under (b) of this subsection. During the 33 34 which termination for nonperformance is in effect, year in 35 organizations shall review alternative delivery strategies to include 36 reorganization of the contracting organization, merging of previous efforts with existing regional partners, and other specific steps 37

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toward improved performance. At the end of the period of termination, the department may contract with the associate development organization or its successor as it deems appropriate.

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Contracts with associate development 5 organizations shall be awarded according to the following annual 6 schedule:

7 (1) For associate development associations in urban counties, which are counties other than rural counties as defined in RCW 43.160.020, a 8 locally matched one dollar per capita allocation totaling no more than 9 four hundred thousand dollars per organization each state fiscal year; 10 (2) For associate development associations in rural counties, as 11 defined in RCW 43.160.020, a per county base allocation of thirty 12 thousand dollars and a locally matched seventy cents per capita 13 14 allocation.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Sections 3 and 4 of this act are each added 16 to chapter 43.330 RCW.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2007, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.

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
