- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.176.020 and 2004 c 237 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
 - (1) "Business incubator" means a facility that offers:
- 9 (a) Space for start-up and expanding firms;
- 10 (b) The shared use of equipment and work areas;
- 11 (c) Daily management support services essential to high-quality 12 commercial operations; and
- 13 (d) Technical assistance.
- 14 (2) <u>"Entrepreneurial support program" means a program offering, on</u>
- 15 an ongoing basis, start-up or emerging businesses business-related
- 16 training and services as well as technical assistance, including
- 17 operational development, business development, and financing.
- 18 (3) "Emerging business" means a business: (a) That is engaged in
- 19 <u>activities related to the development of initial project or service</u>

offerings, such as prototype development or establishment of initial production or services processes; or (b) that is less than three years old and during the previous fiscal year had gross revenues of no more than two million dollars.

- (4) "Qualified small business incubator" means ((an)) a small business incubator or entrepreneurial support program that is:
- (a)(i) Designated as a nonprofit organization under section 501(c)(3) or (6) of the internal revenue code, or (ii) consists of a partnership between a designated nonprofit organization under section 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code and a government or quasi-government agency; and
- 12 (b) ((Focused on developing small businesses in an economically 13 distressed or disadvantaged area; and
 - (c))) Structured around a sound business plan.
