1 AN ACT Relating to removing the limitations on the number of 2 divisions and assistant directors within the department of retirement 3 systems; and amending RCW 41.50.050 and 41.50.070.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 41.50.050 and 1995 c 239 s 317 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 The director shall:

8 (1) Have the authority to organize the department into ((not more
9 than four)) divisions, each headed by an assistant director;

10 (2) Have free access to all files and records of various funds 11 assigned to the department and inspect and audit the files and records 12 as deemed necessary;

13 (3) Employ personnel to carry out the general administration of the 14 department;

15 (4) Submit an annual written report of the activities of the 16 department to the governor and the chairs of the appropriate 17 legislative committees with one copy to the staff of each of the 18 committees, including recommendations for statutory changes the 19 director believes to be desirable; (5) Adopt such rules ((and regulations)) as are necessary to carry
 out the powers, duties, and functions of the department pursuant to the
 provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW.

4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 41.50.070 and 1975-'76 2nd ex.s. c 105 s 9 are each 5 amended to read as follows:

In addition to the exemptions set forth in RCW 41.06.070, the assistant directors((, not to exceed two,)) and an internal auditor shall also be exempt from the application of the state civil service law, chapter 41.06 RCW.

The officers and exempt personnel appointed by the director 10 pursuant to this section shall be paid salaries fixed by the governor 11 in accordance with the procedure established by law for fixing salaries 12 for officers exempt from the operation of the state civil service law. 13 All employees classified under chapter 41.06 RCW and engaged in 14 duties pertaining to the functions transferred by this chapter shall be 15 16 assigned to the department to perform their usual duties upon the same 17 terms as formerly, without any loss of rights, subject to any action 18 that may be appropriate thereafter in accordance with the laws and rules governing the state merit system. 19

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
