AN ACT Relating to prioritizing existing funding for special safety corridor projects; amending RCW 46.68.090; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.68.090 and 2005 c 314 s 103 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) All moneys that have accrued or may accrue to the motor vehicle 8 fund from the motor vehicle fuel tax and special fuel tax shall be 9 first expended for purposes enumerated in (a) and (b) of this 10 subsection. The remaining net tax amount shall be distributed monthly 11 by the state treasurer in accordance with subsections (2) through (7) 12 of this section.

(a) For payment of refunds of motor vehicle fuel tax and specialfuel tax that has been paid and is refundable as provided by law;

15 (b) expended pursuant For payment of amounts to be to appropriations for the administrative expenses of the offices of state 16 treasurer, state auditor, and the department of licensing of the state 17 of Washington in the administration of the motor vehicle fuel tax and 18 19 the special fuel tax, which sums shall be distributed monthly.

(2) All of the remaining net tax amount collected under RCW
 82.36.025(1) and 82.38.030(1) shall be distributed as set forth in (a)
 through (j) of this section.

4 (a) For distribution to the motor vehicle fund an amount equal to
5 44.387 percent to be expended for highway purposes of the state as
6 defined in RCW 46.68.130;

7 (b) For distribution to the special category C account, hereby 8 created in the motor vehicle fund, an amount equal to 3.2609 percent to 9 be expended for special category C projects. Special category C 10 projects are category C projects that, due to high cost only, will 11 require bond financing to complete construction.

12 The following criteria, listed in order of priority, shall be used 13 in determining which special category C projects have the highest 14 priority:

15 (i) Accident experience;

16 (ii) Fatal accident experience;

17 (iii) Capacity to move people and goods safely and at reasonable 18 speeds without undue congestion; and

19 (iv) Continuity of development of the highway transportation 20 network.

21 Moneys deposited in the special category C account in the motor 22 vehicle fund may be used for payment of debt service on bonds the 23 proceeds of which are used to finance special category C projects under 24 this subsection (2)(b);

(c) For distribution to the Puget Sound ferry operations account inthe motor vehicle fund an amount equal to 2.3283 percent;

(d) For distribution to the Puget Sound capital constructionaccount in the motor vehicle fund an amount equal to 2.3726 percent;

(e) For distribution to the urban arterial trust account in the motor vehicle fund an amount equal to 7.5597 percent;

(f) For distribution to the transportation improvement account in the motor vehicle fund an amount equal to 5.6739 percent and expended in accordance with RCW 47.26.086;

34 (g) For distribution to the cities and towns from the motor vehicle 35 fund an amount equal to 10.6961 percent in accordance with RCW 36 46.68.110;

(h) For distribution to the counties from the motor vehicle fund anamount equal to 19.2287 percent: (i) Out of which there shall be

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distributed from time to time, as directed by the department of transportation, those sums as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of RCW 47.56.725; and (ii) less any amounts appropriated to the county road administration board to implement the provisions of RCW 47.56.725(4), with the balance of such county share to be distributed monthly as the same accrues for distribution in accordance with RCW 46.68.120;

8 (i) For distribution to the county arterial preservation account, hereby created in the motor vehicle fund an amount equal to 1.9565 9 These funds shall be distributed by the county road 10 percent. 11 administration board to counties in proportions corresponding to the 12 number of paved arterial lane miles in the unincorporated area of each 13 county and shall be used for improvements to sustain the structural, safety, and operational integrity of county arterials. The county road 14 administration board shall adopt reasonable rules and develop policies 15 16 to implement this program and to assure that a pavement management 17 system is used;

(j) For distribution to the rural arterial trust account in the motor vehicle fund an amount equal to 2.5363 percent and expended in accordance with RCW 36.79.020*i*

21 (k) For distribution to the special safety corridor account, hereby 22 created in the motor vehicle fund, an amount equal to 4.3478 percent to 23 be expended for special safety corridor projects. Special safety 24 corridor projects are projects that may require bond financing to 25 complete construction and safety improvements.

26 The following criteria shall be used in determining which special 27 safety corridor projects have the highest priority:

28 (i) Fatal accident experience;

29 (ii) Historic underfunding of safety improvements;

30 (iii) Ability to leverage additional nonstate revenue sources;

31 (iv) Contribute to the economic development of the corridor; and

- 32 (v) Provide additional capacity to move people and goods safely.
- 33 The following projects, listed in order of priority, are eligible 34 for special safety corridor account funding:

35 <u>(A) State route number 2 beginning near the junction with state</u> 36 route number 9 at milepost 5 to the King county line at Stevens Pass 37 near milepost 64;

- 1 (B) State route number 97 beginning at milepost 0 to milepost 63; 2 and
 - 3 (C) State route number 20 beginning near Sedro Woolley at milepost
 4 64 to near Newport at milepost 436.

5 <u>Moneys deposited in the special safety corridor account in the</u> 6 <u>motor vehicle fund may be used for payment of debt service on bonds the</u> 7 <u>proceeds of which are used to finance special safety corridor projects</u> 8 under this subsection (2)(k).

- 9 (3) The remaining net tax amount collected under RCW 82.36.025(2) 10 and 82.38.030(2) shall be distributed to the transportation 2003 11 account (nickel account).
- 12 (4) The remaining net tax amount collected under RCW 82.36.025(3)
 13 and 82.38.030(3) shall be distributed as follows:
- (a) 8.3333 percent shall be distributed to the incorporated citiesand towns of the state in accordance with RCW 46.68.110;
- 16 (b) 8.3333 percent shall be distributed to counties of the state in 17 accordance with RCW 46.68.120; and
- 18 (c) The remainder shall be distributed to the transportation 19 partnership account created in RCW 46.68.290.
- (5) The remaining net tax amount collected under RCW 82.36.025(4)
 and 82.38.030(4) shall be distributed as follows:
- (a) 8.3333 percent shall be distributed to the incorporated citiesand towns of the state in accordance with RCW 46.68.110;
- (b) 8.3333 percent shall be distributed to counties of the state inaccordance with RCW 46.68.120; and
- 26 (c) The remainder shall be distributed to the transportation 27 partnership account created in RCW 46.68.290.
- (6) The remaining net tax amount collected under RCW 82.36.025 (5)
 and (6) and 82.38.030 (5) and (6) shall be distributed to the
 transportation partnership account created in RCW 46.68.290.
- 31 (7) Nothing in this section or in RCW 46.68.130 may be construed so 32 as to violate any terms or conditions contained in any highway 33 construction bond issues now or hereafter authorized by statute and 34 whose payment is by such statute pledged to be paid from any excise 35 taxes on motor vehicle fuel and special fuels.
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NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate

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1 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 2 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 3 July 1, 2007.

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
