1 AN ACT Relating to establishing a cemetery district in a county; 2 and amending RCW 68.52.100 and 68.52.170.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 68.52.100 and 1994 c 223 s 74 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

For the purpose of forming a cemetery district, a petition 6 7 designating the boundaries of the proposed district by metes and bounds 8 or describing the lands to be included in the proposed district by government townships, ranges and legal subdivisions, signed by not less 9 10 than ((fifteen)) ten percent of the registered voters who reside within the boundaries of the proposed district, setting forth the object of 11 the formation of such district and stating that the establishment 12 thereof will be conducive to the public welfare and convenience, shall 13 be filed with the county auditor of the county within which the 14 15 proposed district is located, accompanied by an obligation signed by two or more petitioners agreeing to pay the cost of publishing the 16 notice hereinafter provided for. The county auditor shall, within 17 thirty days from the date of filing of such petition, examine the 18 19 signatures and certify to the sufficiency or insufficiency thereof.

1 The name of any person who signed a petition shall not be withdrawn 2 from the petition after it has been filed with the county auditor. If 3 the petition is found to contain a sufficient number of valid 4 signatures, the county auditor shall transmit it, with a certificate of 5 sufficiency attached, to the county legislative authority, which shall 6 thereupon, by resolution entered upon its minutes, receive the same and 7 fix a day and hour when it will publicly hear the petition.

8 Sec. 2. RCW 68.52.170 and 1947 c 6 s 9 are each amended to read as 9 follows:

The returns of such election shall be canvassed at the court house 10 11 on the Monday next following the day of the election, but the canvass 12 may be adjourned from time to time if necessary to await the receipt of election returns which may be unavoidably delayed. The canvassing 13 officials, upon conclusion of the canvass, shall forthwith certify the 14 results thereof in writing to the board of county commissioners. 15 Ιf 16 upon examination of the certificate of the canvassing officials it is 17 found that ((two-thirds)) three-fifths of all the votes cast at said election were in favor of the formation of the cemetery district, the 18 board of county commissioners shall, by resolution entered upon its 19 20 minutes, declare such territory duly organized as a cemetery district 21 under the name theretofore designated and shall declare the three candidates receiving the highest number of votes for cemetery 22 23 commissioners, the duly elected first cemetery commissioners of the 24 district. The clerk of the board of county commissioners shall certify a copy of the resolution and cause it to be filed for record in the 25 26 offices of the county auditor and the county assessor of the county. 27 The certified copy shall be entitled to record without payment of a recording fee. If the certificate of the canvassing officials shows 28 that the proposition to organize the proposed cemetery district failed 29 30 to receive ((two-thirds)) three-fifths of the votes cast at said 31 election, the board of county commissioners shall enter a minute to that effect and all proceedings theretofore had shall become null and 32 void. 33
