AN ACT Relating to limiting property tax increases to one percent by reenacting the provisions of Initiative Measure No. 747; reenacting RCW 84.55.005 and 84.55.0101; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 84.55.005 and 2002 c 1 s 2 are each reenacted to read 6 as follows:

7 As used in this chapter:

8 (1) "Inflation" means the percentage change in the implicit price 9 deflator for personal consumption expenditures for the United States as 10 published for the most recent twelve-month period by the bureau of 11 economic analysis of the federal department of commerce in September of 12 the year before the taxes are payable;

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(2) "Limit factor" means:

(a) For taxing districts with a population of less than ten
thousand in the calendar year prior to the assessment year, one hundred
one percent;

(b) For taxing districts for which a limit factor is authorized under RCW 84.55.0101, the lesser of the limit factor under that section or one hundred one percent;

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(c) For all other districts, the lesser of one hundred one percent
 or one hundred percent plus inflation; and

3 (3) "Regular property taxes" has the meaning given it in RCW4 84.04.140.

5 Sec. 2. RCW 84.55.0101 and 2002 c 1 s 3 are each reenacted to read 6 as follows:

Upon a finding of substantial need, the legislative authority of a 7 taxing district other than the state may provide for the use of a limit 8 factor under this chapter of one hundred one percent or less unless an 9 10 increase greater than this limit is approved by the voters at an 11 election as provided in RCW 84.55.050. In districts with legislative authorities of four members or less, two-thirds of the members must 12 approve an ordinance or resolution under this section. In districts 13 with more than four members, a majority plus one vote must approve an 14 ordinance or resolution under this section. The new limit factor shall 15 16 be effective for taxes collected in the following year only.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 18 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 19 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 20 immediately.

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
