1 AN ACT Relating to methamphetamine task forces; adding a new 2 section to chapter 43.330 RCW; creating a new section; making an 3 appropriation; and providing an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 43.330 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 (1) The department shall accept applications for grants from local
8 law enforcement agencies, local jurisdictions, and community
9 organizations.

10 (2) Any applicant that seeks grant fund а state to а methamphetamine task force or methamphetamine prevention program must 11 first match, on a dollar-for-dollar basis, state moneys allocated for 12 13 methamphetamine task forces with local cash resources or in-kind funds. Moneys allocated by the state must be used to supplement, not supplant, 14 15 other federal, state, local, or in-kind funds or resources used for 16 methamphetamine task force operations and associated services.

17 (3) Grants awarded to local law enforcement agencies shall be used18 solely for the operating costs of methamphetamine task forces.

(4) Applicants may not receive more than one grant per biennium
 under this chapter.

3 (5) To facilitate widespread distribution of funds and services, no
4 individual grant awarded shall exceed one hundred thousand dollars.

5 (6) This section applies to local law enforcement agencies, local 6 jurisdictions, and community organizations in any county with a 7 population of less than four hundred thousand.

8 (7) Local law enforcement agencies, local jurisdictions, and 9 community organizations are encouraged to consider regional agreements 10 for the efficient delivery of funds distributed under this section.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The sum of one million dollars, or as much 12 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending 13 June 30, 2009, from the general fund to the department of community, 14 trade, and economic development for the purposes of section 1 of this 15 act.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. If specific funding for the purposes of this 17 act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by 18 June 30, 2009, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and 19 void.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. Section 1 of this act expires June 30, 2009.

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
