HOUSE BILL 2541

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2008 Regular Session

By Representatives Kelley, McCune, Springer, Williams, Miloscia, and Campbell

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1 AN ACT Relating to reserve accounts and studies for condominium 2 associations; amending RCW 64.34.020, 64.34.304, 64.34.410, and 3 64.34.425; adding new sections to chapter 64.34 RCW; and creating a new 4 section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds, declares, and 7 determines that:

8 (1) Condominium associations are responsible for the maintenance, 9 repair, and replacement of common elements. The cost of performing 10 these responsibilities is determined by the development of a budget, 11 and is funded by owners through association assessments.

12 (2) Major maintenance, repair, and replacement costs are 13 inevitable. Funding of these costs must come from existing cash 14 resources, assessments, or loans. There is concern about the ability 15 of associations and their owners to plan for and fund these costs.

16 (3) It is important that all condominium associations adopt and use 17 a financial planning and budget process that accurately reflects 18 projected annual operating costs and long-term capital or major 19 expenses and that results in a balanced budget. 1 (4) Full and open disclosure to owners and the opportunity for 2 participation by owners in the development of budgets should be 3 provided. Full disclosure of the budget and reserves, if any, should 4 also be made to prospective purchasers.

5 (5) Although condominium associations should be encouraged to fund 6 and maintain reserves, the law should not mandate how condominium 7 associations fund and maintain reserves. The method and manner of 8 funding reserves are best addressed by the members of the condominium 9 association and its elected board of directors.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 64.34 RCW
11 under the subchapter heading "Article 3" to read as follows:

(1) An association is encouraged to establish a reserve account to fund major maintenance, repair, and replacement of common elements, including limited common elements that will require major maintenance, repair, or replacement in more than one and fewer than thirty years. A reserve account shall be established in the name of the association. The board of directors is responsible for administering the reserve account.

19 (2) Unless doing so would impose an unreasonable hardship, an 20 association shall prepare and update a reserve study, in accordance 21 with the association's governing documents and RCW 64.34.224(1). The 22 initial reserve study must be based upon a visual site inspection 23 conducted by a reserve study professional.

(3) Unless doing so would impose an unreasonable hardship, the
association shall update the reserve study annually. At least every
three years, an updated reserve study must be prepared and based upon
a visual site inspection conducted by a reserve study professional.

(4) This section and sections 3 through 7 of this act apply to condominiums governed by chapter 64.32 RCW or this chapter and intended in whole or in part for residential purposes. These sections do not apply to condominiums consisting solely of units that are restricted in the declaration to nonresidential use. An association's governing documents may contain stricter requirements.

34 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 64.34 RCW
 35 under the subchapter heading "Article 3" to read as follows:
 36 (1) A reserve study as described in section 2 of this act is

supplemental to the association's operating and maintenance budget. In preparing a reserve study, the association shall estimate the anticipated major maintenance, repair, and replacement expenses, whose infrequent and significant nature make them impractical to be included in an annual budget.

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(2) A reserve study shall include:

7 (a) A reserve component list, including quantities and estimates
8 for useful life of each reserve component, remaining useful life of
9 each reserve component, and current repair and replacement cost;

10 (b) The date of the study and a statement that the study meets the 11 requirements of this section;

12 (c) The level of reserve study performed:

13 (i) Level I: Full reserve study funding analysis and plan;

14 (ii) Level II: Update with visual site inspection;

15 (iii) Level III: Update with no visual site inspection;

16 (d) The association's reserve account balance;

17 (e) The percentage of the fully funded balance that the reserve 18 account is funded;

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(f) Special assessments already implemented or planned;

20 (g) Interest and inflation assumptions;

21 (h) Current reserve account contribution rate;

22 (i) Recommended reserve account contribution rate;

(j) Projected reserve account balance for a minimum of twenty years
 and a funding plan to pay for projected expenses from those reserves
 without reliance on future unplanned special assessments; and

26 (k) Whether the reserve study was prepared with the assistance of 27 a reserve study professional.

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(3) A reserve study shall include the following disclosure:

"This reserve study should be reviewed carefully. 29 Ιt may not include all common and limited common element 30 components that will require major maintenance, repair, or 31 32 replacement in future years, and may not include regular contributions to a reserve account for the cost of such 33 maintenance, repair, or replacement. The failure to include a 34 component in a reserve study, or to provide contributions to a 35 reserve account for a component, may, under some circumstances, 36 37 require you to pay on demand as a special assessment your share 1 of common expenses for the cost of major maintenance, repair, 2 or replacement of a reserve component."

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 64.34 RCW 4 under the subchapter heading "Article 3" to read as follows:

An association may withdraw funds from its reserve account to pay 5 for unforeseen or unbudgeted expenses. The board of directors shall 6 7 record any such withdrawal in the minute books of the association, cause notice of any such withdrawal to be hand delivered or sent 8 prepaid by first-class United States mail to the mailing address of 9 each unit or to any other mailing address designated in writing by the 10 unit owner, and adopt a repayment schedule not to exceed twenty-four 11 months unless it determines that repayment within twenty-four months 12 would impose an unreasonable burden on the unit owners. 13

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 64.34 RCW 15 under the subchapter heading "Article 3" to read as follows:

16 (1) Where more than three years have passed since the date of the last reserve study prepared by a reserve study professional, the owners 17 of the units to which at least twenty percent of the votes are 18 allocated may demand, in writing, to the association that the cost of 19 20 a reserve study be included in the next budget and that the study be obtained by the end of that budget year. The written demand must refer 21 to this section. The board of directors shall, upon receipt of the 22 written demand, provide unit owners making the demand reasonable 23 assurance that the board of directors will include a reserve study in 24 25 the next budget and, if the budget is not rejected by the owners, will arrange for the completion of a reserve study. 26

(2) In the event a written demand is made and a reserve study is 27 not timely prepared, a court may order specific performance and award 28 29 reasonable attorneys' fees to the prevailing party in any legal action 30 brought to enforce this section. An association may assert unreasonable hardship as an affirmative defense in any action brought 31 against it under this section. Without limiting this affirmative 32 defense, an unreasonable hardship exists where the cost of preparing a 33 reserve study would exceed ten percent of the association's annual 34 35 budget.

36 (3) A unit owner's duty to pay for common expenses shall not be 37 excused because of the association's failure to comply with this

section or sections 3 through 7 of this act. A budget ratified by the unit owners under RCW 64.34.308(3) may not be invalidated because of the association's failure to comply with this section or sections 3 through 7 of this act.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 64.34 RCW 5 6 under the subchapter heading "Article 3" to read as follows: 7 Subject to section 5 of this act, the decisions relating to the 8 preparation and updating of a reserve study must be made by the board of directors of the association in the exercise of the reasonable 9 discretion of the board. Such decisions must include whether a reserve 10 study will be prepared or updated, and whether the assistance of a 11 reserve study professional will be utilized. 12

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 64.34 RCW 14 under the subchapter heading "Article 3" to read as follows:

15 Monetary damages or any other liability may not be awarded against or imposed upon the association, the officers or board of directors of 16 17 the association, or those persons who may have provided advice or assistance to the association or its officers or directors, for failure 18 to: Establish a reserve account; have a current reserve study prepared 19 20 or updated in accordance with sections 2 through 6 of this act; or make 21 the reserve disclosures in accordance with section 3 of this act and 22 RCW 64.34.410(1)(oo) and 64.34.425(1)(s).

23 **Sec. 8.** RCW 64.34.020 and 2004 c 201 s 9 are each amended to read 24 as follows:

In the declaration and bylaws, unless specifically provided otherwise or the context requires otherwise, and in this chapter:

27 (1) "Affiliate" means any person who controls, is controlled by, or 28 is under common control with the referenced person. A person 29 "controls" another person if the person: (a) Is a general partner, officer, director, or employer of the referenced person; (b) directly 30 or indirectly or acting in concert with one or more other persons, or 31 through one or more subsidiaries, owns, controls, holds with power to 32 33 vote, or holds proxies representing, more than twenty percent of the 34 voting interest in the referenced person; (c) controls in any manner 35 the election of a majority of the directors of the referenced person;

or (d) has contributed more than twenty percent of the capital of the 1 2 referenced person. A person "is controlled by" another person if the other person: (i) Is a general partner, officer, director, or employer 3 of the person; (ii) directly or indirectly or acting in concert with 4 5 one or more other persons, or through one or more subsidiaries, owns, controls, holds with power to vote, or holds proxies representing, more 6 7 than twenty percent of the voting interest in the person; (iii) controls in any manner the election of a majority of the directors of 8 9 the person; or (iv) has contributed more than twenty percent of the capital of the person. Control does not exist if the powers described 10 in this subsection are held solely as security for an obligation and 11 12 are not exercised.

13 (2) "Allocated interests" means the undivided interest in the 14 common elements, the common expense liability, and votes in the 15 association allocated to each unit.

16 (3) "Assessment" means all sums chargeable by the association 17 against a unit including, without limitation: (a) Regular and special 18 assessments for common expenses, charges, and fines imposed by the 19 association; (b) interest and late charges on any delinquent account; 20 and (c) costs of collection, including reasonable attorneys' fees, 21 incurred by the association in connection with the collection of a 22 delinquent owner's account.

23 (4) "Association" or "unit owners' association" means the unit 24 owners' association organized under RCW 64.34.300.

(5) "Board of directors" means the body, regardless of name, withprimary authority to manage the affairs of the association.

(6) "Common elements" means all portions of a condominium otherthan the units.

29 (7) "Common expenses" means expenditures made by or financial 30 liabilities of the association, together with any allocations to 31 reserves.

(8) "Common expense liability" means the liability for common
 expenses allocated to each unit pursuant to RCW 64.34.224.

(9) "Condominium" means real property, portions of which are
designated for separate ownership and the remainder of which is
designated for common ownership solely by the owners of those portions.
Real property is not a condominium unless the undivided interests in

1 the common elements are vested in the unit owners, and unless a 2 declaration and a survey map and plans have been recorded pursuant to 3 this chapter.

4 (10) <u>"Contribution rate" means, in a reserve study as described in</u>
5 <u>section 2 of this act, the dollar amount designated for major</u>
6 <u>maintenance, repair, or replacement of reserve components.</u>

7 (11) "Conversion condominium" means a condominium (a) that at any time before creation of the condominium was lawfully occupied wholly or 8 partially by a tenant or subtenant for residential purposes pursuant to 9 10 a rental agreement, oral or written, express or implied, for which the tenant or subtenant had not received the notice described in (b) of 11 12 this subsection; or (b) that, at any time within twelve months before 13 the conveyance of, or acceptance of an agreement to convey, any unit 14 therein other than to a declarant or any affiliate of a declarant, was lawfully occupied wholly or partially by a residential tenant of a 15 declarant or an affiliate of a declarant and such tenant was not 16 17 notified in writing, prior to lawfully occupying a unit or executing a rental agreement, whichever event first occurs, that the unit was part 18 of a condominium and subject to sale. "Conversion condominium" shall 19 not include a condominium in which, before July 1, 1990, any unit 20 21 therein had been conveyed or been made subject to an agreement to 22 convey to any transferee other than a declarant or an affiliate of a 23 declarant.

(((11))) <u>(12)</u> "Conveyance" means any transfer of the ownership of a unit, including a transfer by deed or by real estate contract and, with respect to a unit in a leasehold condominium, a transfer by lease or assignment thereof, but shall not include a transfer solely for security.

29 (((12))) <u>(13)</u> "Dealer" means a person who, together with such 30 person's affiliates, owns or has a right to acquire either six or more 31 units in a condominium or fifty percent or more of the units in a 32 condominium containing more than two units.

33 (((13))) <u>(14)</u> "Declarant" means:

34 (a) Any person who executes as declarant a declaration as defined
 35 in subsection (((15))) (16) of this section; or

36 (b) Any person who reserves any special declarant right in the 37 declaration; or (c) Any person who exercises special declarant rights or to whom
 special declarant rights are transferred; or

3 (d) Any person who is the owner of a fee interest in the real 4 property which is subjected to the declaration at the time of the 5 recording of an instrument pursuant to RCW 64.34.316 and who directly 6 or through one or more affiliates is materially involved in the 7 construction, marketing, or sale of units in the condominium created by 8 the recording of the instrument.

9 (((14))) <u>(15)</u> "Declarant control" means the right of the declarant 10 or persons designated by the declarant to appoint and remove officers 11 and members of the board of directors, or to veto or approve a proposed 12 action of the board or association, pursuant to RCW 64.34.308 (4) or 13 (5).

14 (((15))) (16) "Declaration" means the document, however 15 denominated, that creates a condominium by setting forth the 16 information required by RCW 64.34.216 and any amendments to that 17 document.

((((16))) (17) "Development rights" means any right or combination 18 of rights reserved by a declarant in the declaration to: (a) Add real 19 property or improvements to a condominium; (b) create units, common 20 21 elements, or limited common elements within real property included or 22 added to a condominium; (c) subdivide units or convert units into common elements; (d) withdraw real property from a condominium; or (e) 23 24 reallocate limited common elements with respect to units that have not 25 been conveyed by the declarant.

26 (((17))) <u>(18)</u> "Dispose" or "disposition" means a voluntary transfer 27 or conveyance to a purchaser or lessee of any legal or equitable 28 interest in a unit, but does not include the transfer or release of a 29 security interest.

30 (((18))) <u>(19)</u> "Eligible mortgagee" means the holder of a mortgage 31 on a unit that has filed with the secretary of the association a 32 written request that it be given copies of notices of any action by the 33 association that requires the consent of mortgagees.

34 (((19))) <u>(20)</u> "Foreclosure" means a forfeiture or judicial or 35 nonjudicial foreclosure of a mortgage or a deed in lieu thereof.

36 (((20))) <u>(21) "Fully funded balance" means the current value of the</u> 37 <u>deteriorated portion of all the reserve components.</u> (22) "Identifying number" means the designation of each unit in a
 condominium.

3 (((21))) <u>(23)</u> "Leasehold condominium" means a condominium in which 4 all or a portion of the real property is subject to a lease, the 5 expiration or termination of which will terminate the condominium or 6 reduce its size.

7 (((22))) <u>(24)</u> "Limited common element" means a portion of the 8 common elements allocated by the declaration or by operation of RCW 9 64.34.204 (2) or (4) for the exclusive use of one or more but fewer 10 than all of the units.

11 (((23))) <u>(25)</u> "Master association" means an organization described 12 in RCW 64.34.276, whether or not it is also an association described in 13 RCW 64.34.300.

14 (((24))) <u>(26)</u> "Mortgage" means a mortgage, deed of trust or real 15 estate contract.

16 (((25))) <u>(27)</u> "Person" means a natural person, corporation, 17 partnership, limited partnership, trust, governmental subdivision or 18 agency, or other legal entity.

19 (((26))) (28) "Purchaser" means any person, other than a declarant 20 or a dealer, who by means of a disposition acquires a legal or 21 equitable interest in a unit other than (a) a leasehold interest, 22 including renewal options, of less than twenty years at the time of 23 creation of the unit, or (b) as security for an obligation.

24 ((((27))) <u>(29)</u> "Real property" means any fee, leasehold or other 25 estate or interest in, over, or under land, including structures, fixtures, and other improvements thereon and easements, rights and 26 27 interests appurtenant thereto which by custom, usage, or law pass with a conveyance of land although not described in the contract of sale or 28 instrument of conveyance. "Real property" includes parcels, with or 29 without upper or lower boundaries, and spaces that may be filled with 30 31 air or water.

32 (((28))) (30) "Replacement expense" means the anticipated actual 33 cost of replacing a reserve component.

34 (31) "Residential purposes" means use for dwelling or recreational
 35 purposes, or both.

36 (((29))) (32) "Reserve components" means common elements whose cost 37 of maintenance, repair, or replacement is infrequent, significant, and 38 impractical to include in an annual budget. 1 (33) "Reserve study professional" means an independent person
2 suitably qualified by knowledge, skill, experience, training, or
3 education to prepare a reserve study in accordance with sections 2 and
4 3 of this act.

(34) "Special declarant rights" means rights reserved for the 5 benefit of a declarant to: (a) Complete improvements indicated on б 7 survey maps and plans filed with the declaration under RCW 64.34.232; (b) exercise any development right under RCW 64.34.236; (c) maintain 8 sales offices, management offices, signs advertising the condominium, 9 10 and models under RCW 64.34.256; (d) use easements through the common elements for the purpose of making improvements within the condominium 11 12 or within real property which may be added to the condominium under RCW 13 64.34.260; (e) make the condominium part of a larger condominium or a 14 development under RCW 64.34.280; (f) make the condominium subject to a master association under RCW 64.34.276; or (g) appoint or remove any 15 16 officer of the association or any master association or any member of the board of directors, or to veto or approve a proposed action of the 17 board or association, during any period of declarant control under RCW 18 64.34.308(4). 19

20 (((30))) (35) "Timeshare" shall have the meaning specified in the 21 timeshare act, RCW 64.36.010(11).

(((31))) (36) "Unit" means a physical portion of the condominium designated for separate ownership, the boundaries of which are described pursuant to RCW 64.34.216(1)(d). "Separate ownership" includes leasing a unit in a leasehold condominium under a lease that expires contemporaneously with any lease, the expiration or termination of which will remove the unit from the condominium.

(((32))) <u>(37)</u> "Unit owner" means a declarant or other person who owns a unit or leases a unit in a leasehold condominium under a lease that expires simultaneously with any lease, the expiration or termination of which will remove the unit from the condominium, but does not include a person who has an interest in a unit solely as security for an obligation. "Unit owner" means the vendee, not the vendor, of a unit under a real estate contract.

35 (38) "Useful life" means the total number of years of estimated 36 service life of a reserve component before major maintenance, repair, 37 or replacement expense is estimated to occur. 1 Sec. 9. RCW 64.34.304 and 1993 c 429 s 11 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, and 4 subject to the provisions of the declaration, the association may:

(a) Adopt and amend bylaws, rules, and regulations;

6 (b) Adopt and amend budgets for revenues, expenditures, and 7 reserves, and impose and collect assessments for common expenses from 8 unit owners;

9 (c) Hire and discharge or contract with managing agents and other 10 employees, agents, and independent contractors;

(d) Institute, defend, or intervene in litigation or administrative proceedings in its own name on behalf of itself or two or more unit owners on matters affecting the condominium;

14 (e) Make contracts and incur liabilities;

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15 (f) Regulate the use, maintenance, repair, replacement, and 16 modification of common elements;

17 (g) Cause additional improvements to be made as a part of the 18 common elements;

(h) Acquire, hold, encumber, and convey in its own name any right, title, or interest to real or personal property, but common elements may be conveyed or subjected to a security interest only pursuant to RCW 64.34.348;

(i) Grant easements, leases, licenses, and concessions through or over the common elements and petition for or consent to the vacation of streets and alleys;

(j) Impose and collect any payments, fees, or charges for the use, rental, or operation of the common elements, other than limited common elements described in RCW 64.34.204 (2) and (4), and for services provided to unit owners;

(k) Impose and collect charges for late payment of assessments 30 31 pursuant to RCW 64.34.364(13) and, after notice and an opportunity to 32 be heard by the board of directors or by such representative designated by the board of directors and in accordance with such procedures as 33 provided in the declaration or bylaws or rules and regulations adopted 34 by the board of directors, levy reasonable fines in accordance with a 35 previously established schedule thereof adopted by the board of 36 37 directors and furnished to the owners for violations of the 38 declaration, bylaws, and rules and regulations of the association;

(1) Impose and collect reasonable charges for the preparation and
 recording of amendments to the declaration, resale certificates
 required by RCW 64.34.425, and statements of unpaid assessments;

4 (m) Provide for the indemnification of its officers and board of 5 directors and maintain directors' and officers' liability insurance;

6 (n) Assign its right to future income, including the right to 7 receive common expense assessments, but only to the extent the 8 declaration provides;

9 (o) Join in a petition for the establishment of a parking and 10 business improvement area, participate in the rate payers' board or 11 other advisory body set up by the legislative authority for operation 12 of a parking and business improvement area, and pay special assessments 13 levied by the legislative authority on a parking and business 14 improvement area encompassing the condominium property for activities 15 and projects which benefit the condominium directly or indirectly;

16 (p) Establish and administer a reserve fund as described in section 17 <u>2 of this act;</u>

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(q) Prepare a reserve study as described in section 2 of this act;

19 (r) Exercise any other powers conferred by the declaration or 20 bylaws;

21 (((+q))) (s) Exercise all other powers that may be exercised in this 22 state by the same type of corporation as the association; and

23 (((r))) <u>(t)</u> Exercise any other powers necessary and proper for the 24 governance and operation of the association.

(2) The declaration may not impose limitations on the power of the association to deal with the declarant which are more restrictive than the limitations imposed on the power of the association to deal with other persons.

29 Sec. 10. RCW 64.34.410 and 2005 c 456 s 19 are each amended to 30 read as follows:

31 (1) A public offering statement shall contain the following 32 information:

33 (a) The name and address of the condominium;

34 (b) The name and address of the declarant;

35 (c) The name and address of the management company, if any;

36 (d) The relationship of the management company to the declarant, if 37 any;

(e) A list of up to the five most recent condominium projects 1 2 completed by the declarant or an affiliate of the declarant within the past five years, including the names of the condominiums, their 3 4 addresses, and the number of existing units in each. For the purpose 5 of this section, a condominium is "completed" when any one unit therein has been rented or sold; 6

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(f) The nature of the interest being offered for sale;

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(g) A brief description of the permitted uses and use restrictions pertaining to the units and the common elements; 9

(h) A brief description of the restrictions, if any, on the renting 10 11 or leasing of units by the declarant or other unit owners, together with the rights, if any, of the declarant to rent or lease at least a 12 majority of units; 13

(i) The number of existing units in the condominium and the maximum 14 number of units that may be added to the condominium; 15

16 (j) A list of the principal common amenities in the condominium 17 which materially affect the value of the condominium and those that will or may be added to the condominium; 18

19 (k) A list of the limited common elements assigned to the units 20 being offered for sale;

(1) The identification of any real property not in the condominium, 21 22 the owner of which has access to any of the common elements, and a 23 description of the terms of such access;

(m) The identification of any real property not in the condominium 24 to which unit owners have access and a description of the terms of such 25 26 access;

27 (n) The status of construction of the units and common elements, including estimated dates of completion if not completed; 28

(o) The estimated current common expense liability for the units 29 30 being offered;

31 (p) An estimate of any payment with respect to the common expense 32 liability for the units being offered which will be due at closing;

33 (q) The estimated current amount and purpose of any fees not included in the common expenses and charged by the declarant or the 34 association for the use of any of the common elements; 35

36 (r) Any assessments which have been agreed to or are known to the 37 declarant and which, if not paid, may constitute a lien against any 38 units or common elements in favor of any governmental agency;

1 (s) The identification of any parts of the condominium, other than 2 the units, which any individual owner will have the responsibility for 3 maintaining;

4 (t) If the condominium involves a conversion condominium, the 5 information required by RCW 64.34.415;

6 (u) Whether timesharing is restricted or prohibited, and if 7 restricted, a general description of such restrictions;

8 (v) A list of all development rights reserved to the declarant and 9 all special declarant rights reserved to the declarant, together with 10 the dates such rights must terminate, and a copy of or reference by 11 recording number to any recorded transfer of a special declarant right;

12 (w) A description of any material differences in terms of 13 furnishings, fixtures, finishes, and equipment between any model unit 14 available to the purchaser at the time the agreement for sale is 15 executed and the unit being offered;

16 (x) Any liens on real property to be conveyed to the association 17 required to be disclosed pursuant to RCW 64.34.435(2)(b);

(y) A list of any physical hazards known to the declarant which particularly affect the condominium or the immediate vicinity in which the condominium is located and which are not readily ascertainable by the purchaser;

(z) A brief description of any construction warranties to beprovided to the purchaser;

24 (aa) Any building code violation citations received by the 25 declarant in connection with the condominium which have not been 26 corrected;

27 (bb) A statement of any unsatisfied judgments or pending suits against the association, a statement of the status of any pending suits 28 material to the condominium of which the declarant has actual 29 knowledge, and a statement of any litigation brought by an owners' 30 31 association, unit owner, or governmental entity in which the declarant 32 or any affiliate of the declarant has been a defendant, arising out of the construction, sale, or administration of any condominium within the 33 previous five years, together with the results thereof, if known; 34

35 (cc) Any rights of first refusal to lease or purchase any unit or 36 any of the common elements;

37 (dd) The extent to which the insurance provided by the association38 covers furnishings, fixtures, and equipment located in the unit;

(ee) A notice which describes a purchaser's right to cancel the
 purchase agreement or extend the closing under RCW 64.34.420, including
 applicable time frames and procedures;

(ff) Any reports or statements required by RCW 64.34.415 or 4 5 64.34.440(6)(a). RCW 64.34.415 shall apply to the public offering statement of a condominium in connection with which a final certificate 6 7 of occupancy was issued more than sixty calendar months prior to the preparation of the public offering statement whether or not the 8 defined 9 condominium is a conversion condominium as in RCW 10 64.34.020(((10))))) (11);

(gg) A list of the documents which the prospective purchaser is entitled to receive from the declarant before the rescission period commences;

(hh) A notice which states: A purchaser may not rely on any representation or express warranty unless it is contained in the public offering statement or made in writing signed by the declarant or by any person identified in the public offering statement as the declarant's agent;

(ii) A notice which states: This public offering statement is only a summary of some of the significant aspects of purchasing a unit in this condominium and the condominium documents are complex, contain other important information, and create binding legal obligations. You should consider seeking the assistance of legal counsel;

(jj) Any other information and cross-references which the declarant believes will be helpful in describing the condominium to the recipients of the public offering statement, all of which may be included or not included at the option of the declarant;

(kk) A notice that addresses compliance or noncompliance with the housing for older persons act of 1995, P.L. 104-76, as enacted on December 28, 1995;

31 (11) A notice that is substantially in the form required by RCW 32 64.50.050;

33 (mm) A statement, as required by RCW 64.35.210, as to whether the 34 units or common elements of the condominium are covered by a qualified 35 warranty, and a history of claims under any such warranty; ((and))

36 (nn) A statement that the building enclosure has been designed and 37 inspected as required by RCW 64.55.010 through 64.55.090, and, if 1 required, repaired in accordance with the requirements of RCW
2 64.55.090; and

3 (oo) If the association does not have a reserve study that has been
4 prepared in accordance with sections 2 and 3 of this act or its

(2) The public offering statement shall include copies of each of 12 the following documents: The declaration, the survey map and plans, 13 the articles of incorporation of the association, bylaws of the 14 15 association, rules and regulations, if any, current or proposed budget for the association, the balance sheet of the association current 16 within ninety days if assessments have been collected for ninety days 17 or more, the association's current reserve study, if any, and the 18 inspection and repair report or reports prepared in accordance with the 19 20 requirements of RCW 64.55.090.

If any of the foregoing documents listed in this subsection are not available because they have not been executed, adopted, or recorded, drafts of such documents shall be provided with the public offering statement, and, before closing the sale of a unit, the purchaser shall be given copies of any material changes between the draft of the proposed documents and the final documents.

(3) The disclosures required by subsection (1)(g), (k), (s), (u),
(v), and (cc) of this section shall also contain a reference to
specific sections in the condominium documents which further explain
the information disclosed.

31 (4) The disclosures required by subsection (1)(ee), (hh), (ii), and 32 (11) of this section shall be located at the top of the first page of 33 the public offering statement and be typed or printed in ten-point bold 34 face type size.

(5) A declarant shall promptly amend the public offering statement
 to reflect any material change in the information required by this
 section.

1 Sec. 11. RCW 64.34.425 and 2004 c 201 s 4 are each amended to read 2 as follows:

(1) Except in the case of a sale where delivery of a public 3 offering statement is required, or unless exempt under 4 RCW 5 64.34.400(2), a unit owner shall furnish to a purchaser before execution of any contract for sale of a unit, or otherwise before б 7 conveyance, a resale certificate, signed by an officer or authorized agent of the association and based on the books and records of the 8 association and the actual knowledge of the person signing the 9 10 certificate, containing:

(a) A statement disclosing any right of first refusal or other restraint on the free alienability of the unit contained in the declaration;

(b) A statement setting forth the amount of the monthly common expense assessment and any unpaid common expense or special assessment currently due and payable from the selling unit owner and a statement of any special assessments that have been levied against the unit which have not been paid even though not yet due;

(c) A statement, which shall be current to within forty-five days,
of any common expenses or special assessments against any unit in the
condominium that are past due over thirty days;

(d) A statement, which shall be current to within forty-five days,
of any obligation of the association which is past due over thirty
days;

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(e) A statement of any other fees payable by unit owners;

(f) A statement of any anticipated repair or replacement cost in
excess of five percent of the annual budget of the association that has

(r) A statement, as required by RCW 64.35.210, as to whether the units or common elements of the condominium are covered by a qualified warranty, and a history of claims under any such warranty; and

(2) The association, within ten days after a request by a unit 1 2 owner, and subject to payment of any fee imposed pursuant to RCW 64.34.304(1)(1), shall furnish a resale certificate signed by an 3 officer or authorized agent of the association and containing the 4 information necessary to enable the unit owner to comply with this 5 section. For the purposes of this chapter, a reasonable charge for the 6 7 preparation of a resale certificate may not exceed one hundred fifty The association may charge a unit owner a nominal fee for 8 dollars. updating a resale certificate within six months of the unit owner's 9 request. The unit owner shall also sign the certificate but the unit 10 owner is not liable to the purchaser for any erroneous information 11 12 provided by the association and included in the certificate unless and 13 to the extent the unit owner had actual knowledge thereof.

(3) A purchaser is not liable for any unpaid assessment or fee 14 against the unit as of the date of the certificate greater than the 15 amount set forth in the certificate prepared by the association unless 16 17 and to the extent such purchaser had actual knowledge thereof. A unit 18 owner is not liable to a purchaser for the failure or delay of the association to provide the certificate in a timely manner, but the 19 purchaser's contract is voidable by the purchaser until the certificate 20 has been provided and for five days thereafter or until conveyance, 21 22 whichever occurs first.

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
