1 AN ACT Relating to campus safety and security; amending RCW 2 28B.10.569; and adding a new section to chapter 28B.10 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.10.569 and 1990 c 288 s 7 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) Each institution of higher education with a commissioned police 6 7 force shall report to the Washington association of sheriffs and police 8 chiefs or its successor agency, on a monthly basis, crime statistics for the Washington state uniform crime report, in the format required 9 10 by the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, or its Institutions of higher education which do not have 11 successor agency. 12 commissioned police forces shall report crime statistics through appropriate local law enforcement agencies. 13

14 (2) Each institution of higher education shall publish and 15 distribute a report which shall be updated annually and which shall 16 include the crime statistics as reported under subsection (1) of this 17 section for the most recent three-year period. Upon request, the 18 institution shall provide the report to every person who submits an 19 application for admission to either a main or branch campus, and to each new employee at the time of employment. In its acknowledgment of receipt of the formal application for admission, the institution shall notify the applicant of the availability of such information. The information also shall be provided on an annual basis to all students and employees. Institutions with more than one campus shall provide the required information on a campus-by-campus basis.

7 (3)(a) Within existing resources, each institution of higher 8 education shall provide to ((every new student and new employee)) all 9 students, faculty, and staff, and upon request to other interested 10 persons, ((information which follows the general categories for safety 11 policies and procedures outlined in this section. Such categories 12 shall, at a minimum, include)) a campus safety plan that includes, at 13 a minimum, the following:

14 <u>(i) Data Regarding:</u>

15 (A) Campus enrollments((-));

16 (B) Campus nonstudent workforce profile((-,)); and

- 17 (C) The number ((and duties)) of campus security personnel((-)):
- 18 (ii) Policies, procedures, and programs:
- 19 (A) For preventing and responding to violence and other campus
 20 <u>emergencies;</u>
- 21 (B) Governing weapons on campus, including their storage;
- 22 (C) Applying to controlled substances as defined in RCW 64.44.010;
- 23 <u>and</u>

24 (D) Governing and related to student privacy;

25 <u>(iii) Information about:</u>

26 (A) Sexual assault, domestic violence, and stalking, including 27 contact information for campus and community victim advocates, 28 information on where to view campus policies on complaints, and the 29 name and contact information of the individual or office to whom 30 students and employees may direct complaints of sexual assault, 31 stalking, or domestic violence; and

32 (B) Sexual harassment, including contact information for campus and 33 community victim advocates, information on where to view campus 34 policies on complaints, and the name and contact information of the 35 individual or office to whom students and employees may direct 36 complaints of sexual harassment;

- 37 <u>(iv) Descriptions of:</u>
- 38 (A) The duties of campus security personnel;

(B) Security and mutual assistance arrangements with state and 1 2 local police((, sexual assault and domestic violence and policies on 3 controlled substances)); 4 (C) Methods and options that persons with disabilities or special needs have to access services and programs; 5 (D) Escort and transportation services that provide for individual б 7 security; (E) Mental health and counseling services available to students, 8 9 faculty, and staff; 10 (F) Emergency management plans, including procedures for communicating with students, faculty, staff, the public, and the media, 11 12 following natural and man-made emergencies. 13 ((Information)) (b) The campus safety plan shall include, for the 14 most recent academic year ((also shall include)): (i) A description of ((any)) programs and services offered by ((an 15 institution's student affairs or services department, and by student 16 17 government organizations regarding)) the institution and student-sponsored organizations that provide for crime prevention and 18 counseling((, including a directory)). The description must include a 19 listing of the available services ((and appropriate telephone numbers 20 21 and physical locations of these services. In addition)), the service 22 locations, and how the services may be contacted; and (ii) For institutions maintaining student housing facilities 23 24 ((shall include)), information detailing security policies and programs 25 for those facilities. 26 (c)(i) Institutions with a main campus and one or more branch 27 campuses shall provide the information on a campus-by-campus basis. ((In the case of)) (ii) Community and technical colleges((7 28 colleges)) shall provide such information ((to)) for the main campuses 29 only, and shall provide reasonable alternative information ((at)) for 30 31 any off-campus centers and ((other)) affiliated college sites enrolling 32 less than one hundred students. (4)(a) Each institution shall enter into memoranda of understanding 33 that set forth responsibilities for the various local jurisdictions in 34 35 the event of a campus emergency. (b) Each institution shall enter into mutual aid agreements with 36 37 local jurisdictions regarding the shared use of equipment and technology in the event of a campus emergency. 38

(c) Memoranda of understanding and mutual aid agreements shall be
 updated and included in campus safety plans.

(5)(a) Each institution shall establish a task force ((which 3 shall)) that annually examines campus security and safety issues. 4 5 ((The task force shall review the report published and distributed pursuant to this section in order to ensure the accuracy and 6 7 effectiveness of the report, and make any suggestions for improvement. Each task force shall include representation from the 8 This)) institution's administration, faculty, staff, recognized student 9 10 organization, and police or security organization.

11 (b) Each task force shall review the safety plan published and 12 distributed under this section for its respective institution, in order 13 to ensure its accuracy and effectiveness and to make any suggestions 14 for improvement.

15 (6) The president of each institution shall designate a specific 16 staff person responsible for monitoring and coordinating the 17 institution's compliance with this section.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.10 RCW 19 to read as follows:

20 (1) Each institution of higher education shall take the following 21 actions:

(a) By September 30, 2008, submit a self-study assessing its
ability to ensure the safety of students, faculty, staff,
administration, and visitors on each campus, including an evaluation of
the effectiveness of these measures. Four-year institutions shall
submit their studies to the higher education coordinating board.
Community and technical colleges shall submit their studies to the
state board for community and technical colleges.

(b) By November 30, 2008, submit a plan to address the unmet safety 29 and security needs of each campus, including identification of those 30 31 areas that need to be addressed, including a timetable to make satisfactory progress in addressing those unmet needs. Four-year 32 institutions shall submit their studies to the higher education 33 coordinating board. Community and technical colleges shall submit 34 their studies to the state board for community and technical colleges. 35 36 (c) By October 30th of each even-numbered year, beginning in 2010, each institution shall submit an update to its plan, including an 37

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1 assessment of the results of activities undertaken under any previous 2 year's plan to address unmet safety and security issues, and additional 3 activities, or modifications of current activities, to be undertaken to 4 address remaining safety and security issues at the institution.

5 (2) The higher education coordinating board and the state board for 6 community and technical colleges shall report biennially, beginning 7 December 31, 2010, to the governor and the higher education committees 8 of the house of representatives and the senate on:

9 (a) The efforts of each institution and the extent to which it has 10 complied with RCW 28B.10.569 and subsection (1)(c) of this section; and 11 (b) Recommendations on measures to assist institutions to ensure 12 and enhance campus safety and security.

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
