## HOUSE BILL 2653

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2008 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to the impact of vendor rates on cost shifting between public and private purchasers of medical services; amending RCW 3 43.20A.405; and adding a new section to chapter 74.32 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 74.32 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 In addition to the powers and duties enumerated in RCW 74.32.130, 8 the governor's advisory committee on vendor rates shall conduct an extensive examination of rates paid to licensed health care providers 9 10 to determine whether the rates paid by the department of social and health services are reasonable and necessary to ensure that medical 11 12 program participants have access to accessible, quality services. The 13 examination shall include an evaluation of whether current vendor rates result in a cost shift from public purchasers to private purchasers of 14 15 health care. If expansions of public medical programs are proposed or enacted, the governor's committee on vendor rates shall determine 16 whether a cost shift from public purchasers to private purchasers of 17 health care will occur, and the extent of the cost shift. 18

1 Sec. 2. RCW 43.20A.405 and 1971 ex.s. c 309 s 2 are each amended 2 to read as follows:

3 After obtaining the review and advice of the governor's advisory committee on vendor rates, the secretary shall establish rates of 4 payment for services which are to be purchased: PROVIDED, That the 5 secretary shall afford all interested persons reasonable opportunity to 6 7 submit data, views, or arguments, and shall consider fully all submissions respecting the proposed rates. Prior to the establishment 8 of such rates, the secretary shall give at least twenty days notice of 9 10 such intended action by mail to such persons or agencies as have made 11 timely request of the secretary for advance notice of establishment of 12 such vendor rates. Such rates shall not exceed the amounts reasonable 13 and necessary to assure quality services and shall not exceed the costs 14 reasonably assignable to such services pursuant to cost finding and 15 monitoring procedures to be established by the secretary. Vendor rates for medical services purchased by the department shall include amounts 16 reasonable and necessary to ensure access to licensed health care 17 providers by all medical program participants by eliminating any cost 18 19 shifting due to inadequate vendor rates. Information to support such rates of payment shall be maintained in a form accessible to the 20 21 public.

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
