SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2811

- 1 AN ACT Relating to creating the healthy student grant program;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 28A.630 RCW; and creating new sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the health of 4 NEW SECTION. 5 students is at risk due to overconsumption of nonnutritious food, lack of understanding or interest in sound nutrition and healthy lifestyle 6 7 practices, and insufficient exercise and physical activity. 8 attempt to provide information to students about these risks through 9 classroom instruction in health and fitness courses and physical 10 education, but students need the opportunity for learning activities in 11 health, fitness, and nutrition that are informative, positive, communities 12 engaging, and fun. In many around the state, community-based organizations, hospital foundations, public health 13 14 agencies, and clinics can offer such programs in partnership with the 15 schools.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.630
- 17 RCW to read as follows:
- 18 Subject to funds appropriated for this purpose, the office of the

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- superintendent of public instruction shall allocate funds on a 1 2 competitive basis to support the healthy student grant program created in this section. Healthy student grants shall be used to develop and 3 offer innovative and engaging instruction and activities in health, 4 5 fitness, and nutrition. School districts, community-based hospitals, public health agencies, and other 6 organizations, 7 organizations may submit grant applications. An application by an organization other than a school district must have a school district 8 partner and the school district shall act as the fiscal agent. On an 9 10 annual basis, the office of the superintendent of public instruction shall prepare a report on the activities supported by the grant program 11 12 under this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act shall be known and cited as "the healthy student act."
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2008, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.

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
