State of Washington 60th Legislature 2008 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to responsibility for compensation paid to officers while enrolled in basic law enforcement training; amending RCW 82.14.330; adding new sections to chapter 43.101 RCW; and making an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW 7 to read as follows:

(1) A law enforcement agency shall reimburse an officer's training 8 agency for the total amount of salary and benefits received by the 9 10 officer while he or she was enrolled in basic law enforcement training if the law enforcement agency: (a) Is larger than the training agency, 11 thereby employing a greater number of full-time commissioned officers; 12 and (b) hires the respective officer within twenty-four months of the 13 officer's completion of basic law enforcement training. 14 The law 15 enforcement agency shall reimburse the training agency within ninety 16 days of the officer's first day of employment.

17 (2) For the purposes of this section, "training agency" means a law18 enforcement agency that: (a) Pays salary and any benefits to an

officer while he or she is enrolled in basic law enforcement training; and (b) has ten or less full-time commissioned law enforcement officers.

4 Sec. 2. RCW 82.14.330 and 2003 c 90 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) Beginning in fiscal year 2000, the state treasurer shall 7 transfer into the municipal criminal justice assistance account for distribution under this section from the general fund the sum of four 8 9 million six hundred thousand dollars divided into four equal deposits occurring on July 1, October 1, January 1, and April 1. 10 For each 11 fiscal year thereafter, the state treasurer shall increase the total 12 transfer by the fiscal growth factor, as defined in RCW 43.135.025, forecast for that fiscal year by the office of financial management in 13 November of the preceding year. ((The moneys)) 14

15 (a) Of the total amount deposited in the municipal criminal justice 16 assistance account for distribution under this section, less any moneys 17 appropriated for purposes under subsection (4) of this section, a total of three hundred thousand dollars shall be distributed to the criminal 18 justice training commission to reimburse participating city law 19 enforcement agencies with ten or fewer full-time commissioned patrol 20 21 officers for the cost of temporary replacement of each officer who is enrolled in basic law enforcement training provided in RCW 43.101.200. 22

(b) In addition to any moneys remaining undistributed by the criminal justice training commission in (a) of this subsection, the remaining amount deposited in the municipal criminal justice assistance account shall be distributed to the cities of the state as follows:

27 ((((a))) (<u>i)</u> Twenty percent appropriated for distribution shall be distributed to cities with a three-year average violent crime rate for 28 each one thousand in population in excess of one hundred fifty percent 29 30 of the statewide three-year average violent crime rate for each one 31 thousand in population. The three-year average violent crime rate shall be calculated using the violent crime rates for each of the 32 preceding three years from the annual reports on crime in Washington 33 state as published by the Washington association of sheriffs and police 34 chiefs. Moneys shall be distributed under this subsection $(1)((\frac{a}{a}))$ 35 36 (b)(i) ratably based on population as last determined by the office of 37 financial management, but no city may receive more than one dollar per

capita. ((Moneys remaining undistributed under this subsection at the end of each calendar year shall be distributed to the criminal justice training commission to reimburse participating city law enforcement agencies with ten or fewer full time commissioned patrol officers the cost of temporary replacement of each officer who is enrolled in basic law enforcement training, as provided in RCW 43.101.200.

7 (b)) (ii) Sixteen percent shall be distributed to cities ratably
8 based on population as last determined by the office of financial
9 management, but no city may receive less than one thousand dollars.

10 The moneys deposited in the municipal criminal justice assistance 11 account for distribution under this subsection shall be distributed at 12 such times as distributions are made under RCW 82.44.150.

13 Moneys distributed under this subsection shall be expended exclusively for criminal justice purposes and shall not be used to 14 replace or supplant existing funding. Criminal justice purposes are 15 defined as activities that substantially assist the criminal justice 16 17 system, which may include circumstances where ancillary benefit to the civil justice system occurs, and which includes domestic violence 18 services such as those provided by domestic violence programs, 19 community advocates, and legal advocates, as defined in RCW 70.123.020. 20 21 Existing funding for purposes of this subsection is defined as calendar 22 year 1989 actual operating expenditures for criminal justice purposes. Calendar year 1989 actual operating expenditures for criminal justice 23 24 purposes exclude the following: Expenditures for extraordinary events 25 not likely to reoccur, changes in contract provisions for criminal justice services, beyond the control of the local jurisdiction 26 27 receiving the services, and major nonrecurring capital expenditures.

(2) In addition to the distributions under subsection (1) of thissection:

(a) Ten percent shall be distributed on a per capita basis to 30 cities that contract with another governmental agency for the majority 31 32 of the city's law enforcement services. Cities that subsequently qualify for this distribution shall notify the department of community, 33 34 trade, and economic development by November 30th for the upcoming calendar year. The department of community, trade, and economic 35 development shall provide a list of eligible cities to the state 36 37 treasurer by December 31st. The state treasurer shall modify the distribution of these funds in the following year. Cities have the 38

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1 responsibility to notify the department of community, trade, and 2 economic development of any changes regarding these contractual 3 relationships. Adjustments in the distribution formula to add or 4 delete cities may be made only for the upcoming calendar year; no 5 adjustments may be made retroactively.

6 (b) The remaining fifty-four percent shall be distributed to cities 7 and towns by the state treasurer on a per capita basis. These funds 8 shall be used for: (i) Innovative law enforcement strategies; (ii) 9 programs to help at-risk children or child abuse victim response 10 programs; and (iii) programs designed to reduce the level of domestic 11 violence or to provide counseling for domestic violence victims.

12 The moneys deposited in the municipal criminal justice assistance 13 account for distribution under this subsection, less any moneys appropriated for purposes under subsection (4) of this section, shall 14 be distributed at the times as distributions are made under RCW 15 ((Moneys remaining undistributed under this subsection at 16 82.44.150. 17 the end of each calendar year shall be distributed to the criminal justice training commission to reimburse participating city law 18 enforcement agencies with ten or fewer full-time commissioned patrol 19 officers the cost of temporary replacement of each officer who is 20 21 enrolled in basic law enforcement training, as provided in RCW 22 43.101.200.))

If a city is found by the state auditor to have expended funds received under this subsection in a manner that does not comply with the criteria under which the moneys were received, the city shall be ineligible to receive future distributions under this subsection until the use of the moneys are justified to the satisfaction of the director or are repaid to the state general fund.

(3) Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, the distributions to any city that substantially decriminalizes or repeals its criminal code after July 1, 1990, and that does not reimburse the county for costs associated with criminal cases under RCW 3.50.800 or 3.50.805(2), shall be made to the county in which the city is located.

34 (4) Not more than five percent of the funds deposited to the 35 municipal criminal justice assistance account shall be available for 36 appropriations for enhancements to the state patrol crime laboratory 37 system and the continuing costs related to these enhancements. Funds

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appropriated from this account for such enhancements shall not supplant
 existing funds from the state general fund.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 43.101 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) There is established in the criminal justice training 6 commission a grant program to reimburse law enforcement training 7 agencies for salary and benefits received by an officer in training.

8 (2) The criminal justice training commission shall make grant 9 awards, subject to funds appropriated by the legislature, to training 10 agencies as defined under section 1(2) of this act under the following 11 terms:

(a) Beginning on July 1, 2008, grant awards shall be used to reimburse city law enforcement agencies for each full-time commissioned patrol officer that has been hired and employed at its agency for at least twenty-four months but not more than forty-eight months after such patrol officer has completed training at the criminal justice training commission.

(b) Any portion of a new full-time commissioned officer's salary or
benefits that have been reimbursed under section 1 of this act shall
not be eligible for a grant award under this section.

(c) Eligibility for grant awards shall primarily be given to, but is not limited to, training agencies that show a high level of need, as evidenced by training-related costs, vacancy rates, turnover rates, small agency size, and other exigent financial circumstances.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. The sum of five hundred thousand dollars, or 26 as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal 27 year ending June 30, 2008, from the general fund to the criminal 28 justice training commission for the purposes of implementing section 3 29 of this act.

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
