AN ACT Relating to the designation of the thirteenth day of January of each year as Korean-American day; amending RCW 1.16.050 and 3 43.117.070; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that in the more than one hundred years that Koreans have immigrated to the United States, 6 7 these immigrants and their descendants have made an invaluable 8 contribution to our state and nation. Korean-Americans have worked for many years to better not only their community, but the communities in 9 10 which they live and the state as a whole. The legislature further 11 finds that due to the close friendship between the people of Korea and 12 the United States, it is fitting to recognize their contributions to our society in a dignified and fitting manner. 13

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 1.16.050 and 2003 c 68 s 2 are each amended to read as 15 follows:

16 The following are legal holidays: Sunday; the first day of 17 January, commonly called New Year's Day; the third Monday of January, 18 being celebrated as the anniversary of the birth of Martin Luther King,

Jr.; the third Monday of February to be known as Presidents' Day and to 1 2 be celebrated as the anniversary of the births of Abraham Lincoln and George Washington; the last Monday of May, commonly known as Memorial 3 Day; the fourth day of July, being the anniversary of the Declaration 4 5 of Independence; the first Monday in September, to be known as Labor Day; the eleventh day of November, to be known as Veterans' Day; the б 7 fourth Thursday in November, to be known as Thanksgiving Day; the day immediately following Thanksgiving Day; and the twenty-fifth day of 8 December, commonly called Christmas Day. 9

10 Employees of the state and its political subdivisions, except employees of school districts and except those nonclassified employees 11 12 of institutions of higher education who hold appointments or are 13 employed under contracts to perform services for periods of less than 14 twelve consecutive months, shall be entitled to one paid holiday per calendar year in addition to those specified in this section. 15 Each employee of the state or its political subdivisions may select the day 16 17 on which the employee desires to take the additional holiday provided for herein after consultation with the employer pursuant to guidelines 18 to be promulgated by rule of the appropriate personnel authority, or in 19 20 the case of local government by ordinance or resolution of the 21 legislative authority.

If any of the above specified state legal holidays are also federal legal holidays but observed on different dates, only the state legal holidays shall be recognized as a paid legal holiday for employees of the state and its political subdivisions except that for port districts and the law enforcement and public transit employees of municipal corporations, either the federal or the state legal holiday, but in no case both, may be recognized as a paid legal holiday for employees.

29 Whenever any legal holiday, other than Sunday, falls upon a Sunday, 30 the following Monday shall be the legal holiday.

31 Whenever any legal holiday falls upon a Saturday, the preceding 32 Friday shall be the legal holiday.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to have the effect of adding or deleting the number of paid holidays provided for in an agreement between employees and employers of political subdivisions of the state or as established by ordinance or resolution of the local government legislative authority.

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The legislature declares that the thirteenth day of January shall
be recognized as Korean-American Day but shall not be considered a
legal holiday for any purposes.

The legislature declares that the twelfth day of October shall be recognized as Columbus Day but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

7 The legislature declares that the ninth day of April shall be 8 recognized as former prisoner of war recognition day but shall not be 9 considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

10 The legislature declares that the twenty-sixth day of January shall 11 be recognized as Washington army and air national guard day but shall 12 not be considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

The legislature declares that the seventh day of August shall be recognized as purple heart recipient recognition day but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

The legislature declares that the second Sunday in October be recognized as Washington state children's day but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

The legislature declares that the sixteenth day of April shall be recognized as Mother Joseph day and the fourth day of September as Marcus Whitman day, but neither shall be considered legal holidays for any purpose.

The legislature declares that the seventh day of December be recognized as Pearl Harbor remembrance day but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purpose.

The legislature declares that the nineteenth day of February be recognized as civil liberties day of remembrance but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purpose.

29 Sec. 3. RCW 43.117.070 and 2000 c 236 s 3 are each amended to read 30 as follows:

31 (1) The commission shall examine and define issues pertaining to of Asian Pacific 32 the rights and needs Americans, and make recommendations to the governor and state agencies with respect to 33 desirable changes in program and law. 34

35 (2) The commission shall advise such state government agencies on36 the development and implementation of comprehensive and coordinated

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policies, plans, and programs focusing on the special problems and
needs of Asian Pacific Americans.

3 (3) The commission shall coordinate and assist with statewide 4 celebrations during the fourth week of Asian Pacific American Heritage 5 Month that recognize the contributions to the state by Asian Pacific 6 Americans in the arts, sciences, commerce, and education.

7 (4) <u>The commission shall coordinate and assist educational</u> 8 <u>institutions, public entities, and private organizations with</u> 9 <u>celebrations of Korean-American day that recognize the contributions to</u> 10 <u>the state by Korean-Americans in the arts, sciences, commerce, and</u> 11 <u>education.</u>

12 (5) Each state department and agency shall provide appropriate and 13 reasonable assistance to the commission as needed in order that the 14 commission may carry out the purposes of this chapter.

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
