SENATE BILL 5424

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2007 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to background checks for health care providers; amending RCW 18.130.310; adding new sections to chapter 18.130 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.70 RCW; and providing an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 18.130 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 (1)(a) The department shall establish requirements for each 9 applicant for an initial license to obtain a state background check 10 through the state patrol prior to the issuance of any license. The 11 background check may be fingerprint-based at the discretion of the 12 department.

(b) The department shall specify those situations where a background check under (a) of this subsection is inadequate and an applicant for an initial license must obtain an electronic fingerprintbased national background check through the state patrol and federal bureau of investigation. Situations where a background check is inadequate may include instances where an applicant has recently lived out-of-state or where the applicant has a criminal record in
Washington.

3 (2) The department shall adopt rules to require license holders to 4 report to the disciplining authority and to the individual's employer 5 any arrests, convictions, or other determinations or findings by a law 6 enforcement agency occurring after the effective date of this section 7 for a criminal offense that constitutes unprofessional conduct under 8 this chapter or the chapters specified in RCW 18.130.040(2). The 9 report must be made within fourteen days of the conviction.

10 (3) The department shall conduct an annual review of a 11 representative sample of all license holders who have previously 12 obtained a background check through the department. The selection of 13 the license holders to be reviewed shall be representative of all 14 categories of license holders and geographic locations.

(4)(a) When deciding whether or not to issue an initial license, 15 16 the disciplining authority shall consider the results of any background 17 check conducted pursuant to subsection (1) of this section that reveals a conviction for any criminal offense that constitutes unprofessional 18 19 conduct under this chapter or the chapters specified in RCW 18.130.040(2) or a series of arrests that when considered together 20 21 demonstrate a pattern of behavior that, without investigation, may pose 22 a risk to the safety of the license holder's patients.

(b) If the background check conducted pursuant to subsection (2) of this section reveals any information related to unprofessional conduct that has not been previously disclosed to the disciplining authority, it shall take appropriate disciplinary action against the license holder.

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(5) The department shall:

(a) Require the applicant or license holder to submit full sets offingerprints if necessary to complete the background check;

(b) Require the applicant to submit any fees for background check activities conducted pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, except as precluded by RCW 43.70.110, and other information required by the state patrol;

35 (c) Notify the applicant of the results of the background check; 36 and

37 (d) Restrict use of the background check results to determining the

individual's suitability for a license and to conducting disciplinary
functions.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 18.130 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 Nothing in RCW 18.130.310 or sections 1 and 4 of this act limits 6 the authority of the disciplining authority to investigate the 7 suitability of an individual for holding a license.

8 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.130.310 and 1989 1st ex.s. c 9 s 313 are each 9 amended to read as follows:

Subject to RCW 40.07.040, the disciplinary authority shall submit 10 11 a biennial report to the legislature on its proceedings during the biennium, detailing the number of complaints made, investigated, and 12 adjudicated and manner of disposition. In addition, the report shall 13 provide data on the department's background check activities conducted 14 under sections 1 and 2 of this act and the effectiveness of those 15 activities in identifying potential license holders who may not be 16 <u>qualified to practice safely.</u> The report may include recommendations 17 for improving the disciplinary process, including proposed legislation. 18 19 The department shall develop a uniform report format.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 43.70 RCW 21 to read as follows:

To implement section 1 of this act, the department may increase application and renewal fees by amounts that exceed the fiscal growth factor under RCW 43.135.055.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. Section 1 of this act takes effect January 26 1, 2008.

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
