1 AN ACT Relating to tuition waivers for eligible veteran or national 2 guard medal recipients; and amending RCW 28B.15.621 and 28B.15.910.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.15.621 and 2005 c 249 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) The legislature finds that active military and naval veterans, 6 reserve military and naval veterans, and national guard members called 7 8 to active duty have served their country and have risked their lives to defend the lives of all Americans and the freedoms that define and 9 10 distinguish our nation. The legislature intends to honor active military and naval veterans, reserve military and naval veterans, and 11 12 national guard members who have served on active military or naval duty for the public service they have provided to this country. 13

14 (2) Subject to the limitations in RCW 28B.15.910, the governing
15 boards of the state universities, the regional universities, The
16 Evergreen State College, and the community colleges, may waive all or
17 a portion of tuition and fees for the following persons:

18 (a) An eligible veteran or national guard member;

1 (b) A child and the spouse of an eligible veteran or national guard 2 member who became totally disabled as defined in RCW 28B.15.385 while 3 engaged in active federal military or naval service, or who is 4 determined by the federal government to be a prisoner of war or missing 5 in action;

6 (c) A child and the surviving spouse of an eligible veteran or 7 national guard member who lost his or her life while engaged in active 8 federal military or naval service. However, upon remarriage, the 9 surviving spouse of an eligible veteran or national guard member is 10 ineligible for a waiver under this section.

11 (3) <u>The governing boards of the state universities</u>, the regional 12 <u>universities</u>, <u>The Evergreen State College</u>, and the community colleges 13 <u>may waive all tuition and fees for the following persons:</u>

<u>(a) An eligible medal recipient;</u>

15 (b) A child and the spouse of an eligible veteran or national guard 16 member who became totally disabled as defined in RCW 28B.15.385 while 17 engaged in active federal military or naval service, or who is 18 determined by the federal government to be a prisoner of war or missing 19 in action;

20 (c) A child and the surviving spouse of an eligible veteran or 21 national guard member who lost his or her life while engaged in active 22 federal military or naval service. However, upon remarriage, the 23 surviving spouse of an eligible veteran or national guard member is 24 ineligible for a waiver under this section.

(4) The governing boards of the state universities, the regional 25 universities, The Evergreen State College, and the community colleges, 26 27 may waive all or a portion of tuition and fees for a military or naval veteran who is a Washington domiciliary, but who did not serve on 28 foreign soil or in international waters or in another location in 29 support of those serving on foreign soil or in international waters and 30 31 who does not qualify as an eligible veteran or national guard member 32 under subsection (((5))) (6) of this section. However, there shall be no state general fund support for waivers granted under this 33 subsection. 34

35 (((4))) (5) Private vocational schools and private higher education 36 institutions are encouraged to provide waivers consistent with the 37 terms in subsections (2) ((and (3))) through (4) of this section. 1 (((5) As used in this section)) (6) The definitions in this
2 subsection apply throughout this section.

3 (a) "Eligible veteran or national guard member" means a Washington domiciliary who was an active or reserve member of the United States 4 5 military or naval forces, or a national guard member called to active duty, who served in active federal service, under either Title 10 or 6 7 Title 32 of the United States Code, in a war or conflict fought on foreign soil or in international waters or in another location in 8 support of those serving on foreign soil or in international waters, 9 10 and if discharged from service, has received an honorable discharge.

11 (b) "Eligible medal recipient" means a Washington domiciliary who 12 is an active, reserve, or national guard service member, or any 13 honorably discharged service member from any of the service branches or 14 components of the United States military or naval forces, who has 15 resided in this state for a minimum of one year and who has been 16 awarded either the Afghanistan campaign medal, Iraq campaign medal, or 17 global war on terrorism expeditionary medal.

18 Sec. 2. RCW 28B.15.910 and 2006 c 229 s 2 are each amended to read 19 as follows:

20 (1) For the purpose of providing state general fund support to 21 public institutions of higher education, except for revenue waived under programs listed in subsections (3) and (4) of this section, and 22 23 unless otherwise expressly provided in the omnibus state appropriations 24 act, the total amount of operating fees revenue waived, exempted, or reduced by a state university, a regional university, The Evergreen 25 26 State College, or the community colleges as a whole, shall not exceed the percentage of total gross authorized operating fees revenue in this 27 subsection. As used in this section, "gross authorized operating fees 28 29 revenue" means the estimated gross operating fees revenue as estimated 30 under RCW 82.33.020 or as revised by the office of financial 31 management, before granting any waivers. This limitation applies to all tuition waiver programs established before or after July 1, 1992. 32 33 (a) University of Washington 21 percent (b) Washington State University 34 20 percent

(b) Eastern Washington University 3 percent 1 2 (c) Central Washington University 3 percent (5) The institutions of higher education will participate in 3 outreach activities to increase the number of veterans who receive 4 tuition waivers. Colleges and universities shall revise the 5 application for admissions so that all applicants shall have the 6 opportunity to advise the institution that they are veterans who need 7 8 assistance. ((If a person indicates on the application for admissions that the person is a veteran who is in need of assistance, then the 9 10 institution of higher education shall ask the person whether they have 11 any funds disbursed in accordance with the Montgomery GI Bill available 12 to them. Each institution shall encourage veterans to utilize funds 13 available to them in accordance with the Montgomery GI Bill prior to 14 providing the veteran a tuition waiver.))

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
