1 AN ACT Relating to nonresidents' participation in hunting and 2 organized shooting events; and amending RCW 9.41.170.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9.41.170 and 1996 c 295 s 11 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, it is a 6 7 class C felony for any person who is not a citizen of the United States 8 to carry or possess any firearm, without first having obtained an alien 9 firearm license ((from the director of licensing)). In order to be 10 eligible for a license, an alien must provide proof that he or she is lawfully present in the United States, which ((the director of 11 licensing)) a county sheriff shall verify through the appropriate 12 authorities. Except as provided in subsection (2)(a) of this section, 13 and subject to the additional requirements of subsection (2)(b) of this 14 section, ((the director of licensing)) a county sheriff may issue an 15 16 alien firearm license only upon receiving from the consul domiciled in this state representing the country of the alien, a certified copy of 17 the alien's criminal history in the alien's country indicating the 18

alien is not ineligible under RCW 9.41.040 to own, possess, or control a firearm, and the consul's attestation that the alien is a responsible person.

(2)(a) Subject to the additional requirements of (b) of this 4 subsection, ((the director of licensing)) a county sheriff may issue an 5 alien firearm license without a certified copy of the alien's criminal 6 7 history or the consul's attestation required by subsection (1) of this section, if the alien has been a resident of this state for at least 8 (i) The alien is from a country without a consul 9 two years and: domiciled within this state, or (ii) the consul has failed to provide, 10 within ninety days after a request by the alien, the criminal history 11 12 or attestation required by subsection (1) of this section.

13 (b) Before issuing an alien firearm license under subsection (1) of 14 this section or this subsection (2), the ((director of licensing)) <u>county sheriff</u> shall ((ask the local law enforcement agency of the 15 16 jurisdiction in which the alien resides to)) complete a background and 17 fingerprint check to determine the alien's eligibility under RCW 9.41.040 to own, possess, or control a firearm. The ((law enforcement 18 agency)) <u>background check</u> shall <u>be</u> completed ((a background check)) 19 20 within thirty days after the request, unless the alien does not have a 21 valid Washington driver's license or Washington state identification 22 In the latter case, ((the law enforcement agency)) a county card. 23 sheriff shall complete the background check within sixty days after the 24 request.

A signed application for an alien firearm license shall constitute a waiver of confidentiality and written request that the department of social and health services, mental health institutions, and other health care facilities release information relevant to the applicant's eligibility for an alien firearm license to an inquiring law enforcement agency.

(3) The alien firearm license shall be valid for five years from 31 32 the date of issue so long as the alien is lawfully present in the United States. The nonrefundable fee, paid upon application, for the 33 34 five-year license shall be ((fifty-five)) thirty dollars plus additional charges imposed by the Washington state patrol and the 35 Federal Bureau of Investigation that are passed on to the applicant. 36 37 The <u>nonrefundable license</u> fee shall be ((distributed as follows:

(a) Fifteen dollars shall be paid to the department of licensing;

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1 (b) Twenty-five dollars shall be paid to the Washington state
2 patrol; and

3 (c) Fifteen dollars shall be paid to the local law enforcement 4 agency)) paid to the county sheriff's department conducting the 5 background check.

(4) This section shall not apply to ((Canadian citizens resident in 6 7 a province which has an enactment or public policy providing 8 substantially similar privilege to residents of the state of Washington)) nonimmigrant aliens in possession of a valid Washington 9 hunting license or an invitation or registration to attend a 10 11 competitive target shooting event and who are carrying or possessing 12 weapons for the purpose of using them in the hunting of game while such 13 persons are in the act of hunting, or while on a hunting trip, or while 14 such persons are competing in a bona fide trap or skeet shoot or any other organized contest sponsored by a national, state, or local 15 organization devoted to the competitive or sporting use of firearms 16 17 where rifles, pistols, or shotguns are used, so long as the nonimmigrant alien possesses: 18

(a) A valid passport and visa, if required by the United States,
 showing they are in the country legally; and

(b) An approved United States department of the treasury ATF-6 NIA application and permit for temporary importation of firearms and ammunition by nonimmigrant aliens. Nothing in this section shall be construed to allow aliens to hunt or fish in this state without first having obtained a regular hunting or fishing license.

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
