SENATE BILL 5643

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2007 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to children and families of incarcerated parents; adding a new section to chapter 72.09 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 74.04 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.215 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 28A.300 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 5 43.63A RCW; creating a new section; and making appropriations.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the significant NEW SECTION. 8 impact on the lives and well-being of children and families when a parent is incarcerated. It is the intent of the legislature to support 9 10 children and families, and maintain familial connections when 11 appropriate, during the period a parent is incarcerated. Further, the 12 legislature finds that there must be a greater emphasis placed on identifying state policies and programs impacting children with 13 14 incarcerated parents. Additionally, greater effort must be made to ensure that the policies and programs of the state are supportive of 15 the children, and meet their needs during the time the parent is 16 incarcerated. 17

According to the final report of the children of incarcerated parents oversight committee, helping offenders build durable family 1 relationships may reduce the likelihood that their children will go to 2 prison later in life. Additionally, the report indicates that 3 offenders who reconnect with their families in sustaining ways are less 4 likely to reoffend.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 72.09 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 (1) The secretary of corrections shall review current department 8 policies and assess the adequacy and availability of programs targeted at inmates with children. The secretary shall adopt policies and 9 programs that encourage familial contact and engagement between inmates 10 11 and their children with the goal of facilitating normal child development, while reducing recidivism and intergenerational 12 incarceration. Programs and policies should take into consideration 13 the children's need to maintain contact with his or her parent and the 14 inmate's ability to develop plans to financially support their 15 16 children, assist in reunification when appropriate, and encourage the 17 improvement of parenting skills where needed.

18 (2) The secretary shall designate a policy level staff position to 19 assist in implementing the requirements of subsection (1) of this 20 section and to continue to oversee the policies and programs that are 21 developed pursuant to this section. The functions of the staff shall, 22 at a minimum, include the following:

(a) Gathering information and data on the families of inmates,
 particularly the children of incarcerated parents;

(b) Developing programs and policies that focus on sustaining the family during the parent's incarceration. Programs should be developed to assist parents to gain skills and connections that will help them resume parenting, and create a plan to help the family successfully deal with reintegration, or help them plan how to support the children if they decide not to reunite or if reunification is not in the best interest of the family;

32 (c) Evaluate data to determine the impact on recidivism and 33 intergenerational incarceration; and

34 (d) Participate in the children of incarcerated parents oversight35 committee.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 74.04 RCW
 to read as follows:

3 (1)(a) The secretary of social and health services shall review 4 current department policies and assess the adequacy and availability of 5 programs targeted at persons who receive services through the 6 department who are the children and families of a person who is 7 incarcerated in a department of corrections facility. Great attention 8 shall be focused on programs and policies affecting foster youth who 9 have a parent who is incarcerated.

10 (b) The secretary shall adopt policies and programs that encourage familial contact and engagement between inmates of the department of 11 12 corrections facilities and their children with the goal of facilitating 13 child development, while reducing recidivism normal and 14 intergenerational incarceration. Programs and policies should take into consideration the children's need to maintain contact with his or 15 her parent, the inmate's ability to develop plans to financially 16 17 support their children, assist in reunification when appropriate, and encourage the improvement of parenting skills where needed. 18 The programs and policies should also meet the needs of the child while the 19 20 parent is incarcerated.

(2) The secretary shall designate a policy level staff position to assist in implementing the requirements of subsection (1) of this section and to continue to oversee the policies and programs that are developed pursuant to this section. The functions of the staff shall, at a minimum, include the following:

(a) Gathering information and data on the recipients of public
assistance, or children in the care of the state under chapter 13.34
RCW, who are the children and families of inmates incarcerated in
department of corrections facilities;

30 (b) Developing programs and policies that focus on sustaining the 31 family during the parent's incarceration, particularly the needs of the 32 children during the period the parent is incarcerated;

33 (c) Evaluate data to determine the impact on recidivism and 34 intergenerational incarceration; and

35 (d) Participate in the children of incarcerated parents oversight 36 committee.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 43.215 RCW
 to read as follows:

3 (1)(a) The director of the department of early learning shall 4 review current department policies and assess the adequacy and 5 availability of programs targeted at persons who receive assistance who 6 are the children and families of a person who is incarcerated in a 7 department of corrections facility. Great attention shall be focused 8 on programs and policies affecting foster youth who have a parent who 9 is incarcerated.

10 (b) The director shall adopt policies and programs that support the 11 children of incarcerated parents and meet their needs with the goal of 12 facilitating normal child development, while reducing intergenerational 13 incarceration.

14 (2) The director shall designate a policy level staff position to 15 assist in implementing the requirements of subsection (1) of this 16 section and to continue to oversee the policies and programs that are 17 developed pursuant to this section. The functions of the staff shall, 18 at a minimum, include the following:

(a) Gathering information and data on the recipients of assistance
 who are the children and families of inmates incarcerated in department
 of corrections facilities;

(b) Developing programs and policies that focus on sustaining the family during the parent's incarceration, particularly the needs of the children during the period the parent is incarcerated;

25 (c) Evaluate data to determine the impact on recidivism and 26 intergenerational incarceration; and

(d) Participate in the children of incarcerated parents oversightcommittee.

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
30 RCW to read as follows:

(1) The superintendent of public instruction shall review current policies and assess the adequacy and availability of programs targeted at children who have a parent who is incarcerated in a department of corrections facility. The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt policies and programs that support the children of incarcerated parents and meet their needs with the goal of facilitating normal child

1 development, including maintaining adequate academic progress, while 2 reducing intergenerational incarceration.

3 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall designate a 4 policy level staff position to assist in implementing the requirements 5 of subsection (1) of this section and to continue to oversee the 6 policies and programs that are developed pursuant to this section. The 7 functions of the staff shall, at a minimum, include the following:

8 (a) Gathering information and data on the students who are the 9 children of inmates incarcerated in department of corrections 10 facilities;

(b) Developing programs and policies that focus on sustaining the family during the parent's incarceration, particularly the needs of the children during the period the parent is incarcerated;

14 (c) Evaluate data to determine the impact on recidivism and 15 intergenerational incarceration; and

16 (d) Participate in the children of incarcerated parents oversight 17 committee.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 43.63A RCW 19 to read as follows:

(1)(a) The department of community, trade, and economic development shall establish an advisory committee to monitor, guide, and report on recommendations relating to policies and programs for children and families with incarcerated parents.

24 (b) The advisory committee shall include representatives of the the department of corrections, the department of social and health 25 26 services, the department of early learning, the office of the superintendent of public instruction, representatives of the private 27 nonprofit and business sectors, child advocates, representatives of 28 Washington state Indian tribes as defined under the federal Indian 29 welfare act (25 U.S.C. Sec. 1901 et seq.), court administrators, the 30 31 administrative office of the courts, the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, jail administrators, the office of the 32 33 governor, and others who have an interest in these issues may also be 34 included.

35 (c) The advisory committee shall:

36 (i) Gather the data collected by the departments as required in 37 sections 2 through 5 of this act; 1 (ii) Monitor and provide consultation on the implementation of 2 recommendations contained in the 2006 children of incarcerated parents 3 report;

4 (iii) Identify areas of need and develop recommendations for the 5 legislature, the department of social and health services, the 6 department of corrections, the department of early learning, and the 7 office of the superintendent of public instruction to better meet the 8 needs of children and families of persons incarcerated in department of 9 corrections facilities; and

10 (iv) Provide recommendations to the department of community, trade, 11 and economic development regarding community programs the department 12 should fund with moneys appropriated under sections 7 and 8 of this 13 act.

(d) The children of incarcerated parents oversight committee shall
update the legislature and governor annually on committee activities,
with the first update due by January 1, 2008.

17 (2) The department of community, trade, and economic development shall select community programs or services to receive funding that 18 focus on children and families of inmates incarcerated in a department 19 20 of corrections facility and sustaining the family during the period of 21 the inmate's incarceration. Programs or services which meet the needs 22 of the children of incarcerated parents should be the greatest 23 consideration in the programs that are identified by the department. 24 The department shall consider the recommendations of the advisory 25 committee regarding which services or programs the department should fund. 26

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. The sum of five hundred thousand dollars, or 28 as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal 29 year ending June 30, 2008, from the general fund to the department of 30 community, trade, and economic development for the purpose of enhancing 31 programs and services for the children and families of inmates 32 incarcerated in department of corrections facilities.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** The sum of seven hundred thousand dollars, 34 or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal 35 year ending June 30, 2009, from the general fund to the department of

community, trade, and economic development for the purpose of enhancing
 programs and services for the children and families of inmates
 incarcerated in department of corrections facilities.

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
